Wedding Policy – At least nine months before the wedding, the couple should meet with the pastor, before the wedding dates are selected. At least one member of the family should be a member of our parish.

Baptism Policy – Parents must be registered parishioners and attend a Baptism Class before their child may be baptized. Expectant mothers are encouraged to attend. The class is for parents only – baby-sitting is not provided.

Funeral Policy – Funerals are scheduled Tuesday-Saturday. We discourage funerals Sundays and Mondays. Participation by other priests and deacons must have prior approval of current pastor.

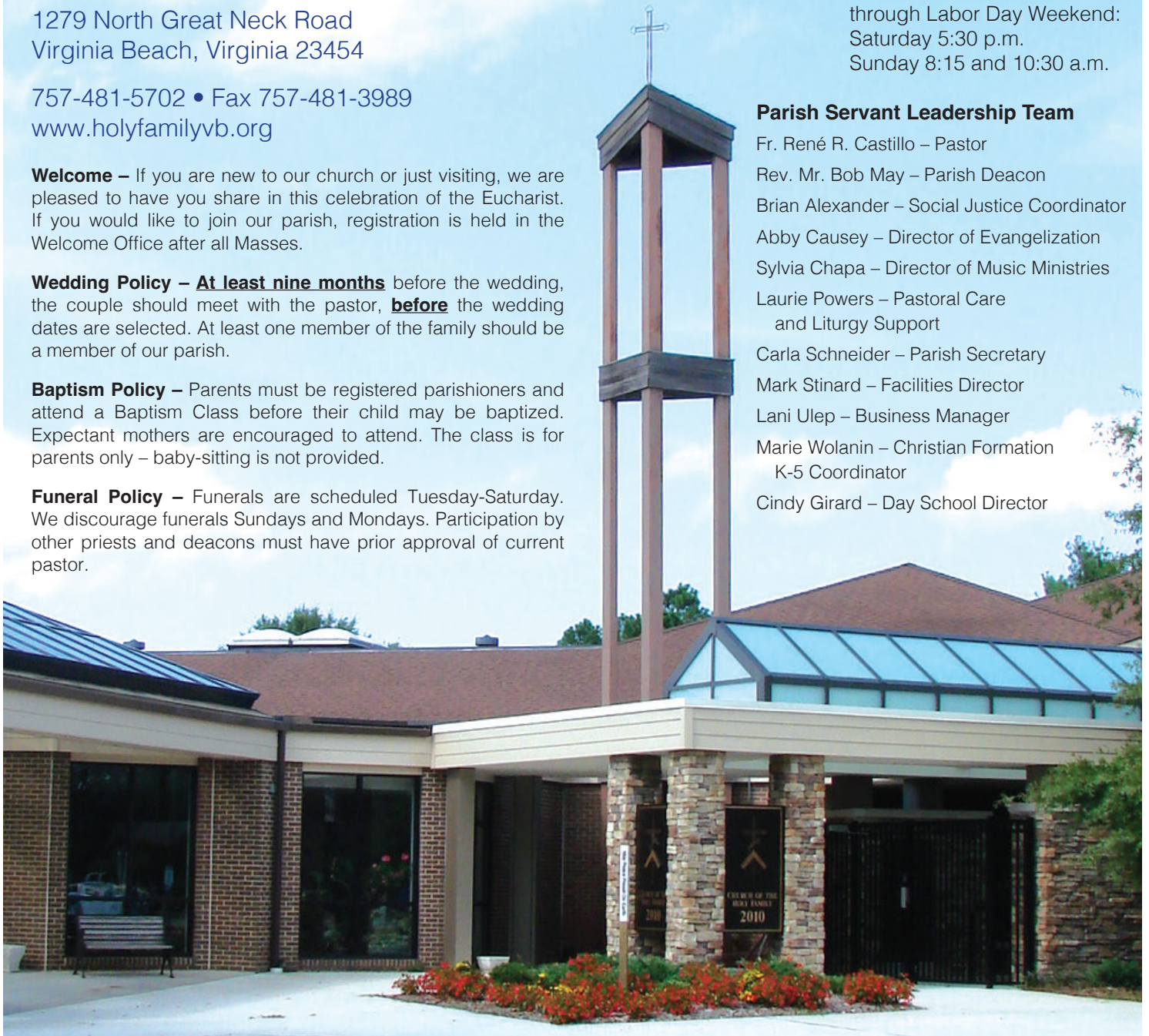

What Will Your Legacy Be?

- As Catholics, we rejoice with faith in the resurrection. Yet we also know the passage from life to death can be stressful on those who survive us.
- You can ease some of that stress by acting now to put your estate plan in order. Who will be executor of your estate? Who will decide how your personal treasures are distributed? In addition to their own grief, can you imagine your loved ones struggling to find life insurance papers, bank accounts and other vital documents?

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

The following article is a condensed adaptation of an interview by the producer of *Living on Earth*, public radio's environmental news magazine, Paloma Beltran, with Christiana Zenner, an associate professor in the Department of Theology at Fordham University in New York. The title of the article is "Q & A: The Pope's New Document on Climate Change is a 'Throwdown' Call for Action." Mr. Beltran states that in *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis says the world is "nearing the breaking point;" he is condemning climate denial, and he calls for urgent climate action. Ms. Zenner responds that *Laudate Deum* is much shorter than *Laudato Si'* and is focused on the realities of climate crises and anthropogenic climate change in particular, as a moral, ecological social problem, and on the responsibility of all people to take action to address these problems. She says that there are a lot of really specific citations of science and a lot of very specific invocations about the kinds of things that need to happen.

Pope Francis calls out the U.S. explicitly saying the rates of consumption here are so far above China, and even more profoundly above peoples and nations that are far less developed.

In the first part of this apostolic exhortation, the Pope talks about climate denialism. Prof. Zenner says he takes it down point-by-point: saying it doesn't hold, it is not tenable, it is not a Catholic point of view, it is not even a reasonable point of view. In a very effective way, she says, he critiques those negative arguments which the denialists will bring up alleging solid scientific data, like the fact that the planet has always had and will have periods of cooling and warming. But they forget to mention another relevant datum, that what we are presently experiencing is an unusual acceleration of warming at such a speed that it will take only one generation in order to verify it. Prof. Zenner's main point is that the Pope is calling those folks to task while encouraging them to take action to protect our planet.

Beltran asks, what does this document say about the connection between the Catholic Church and the scientific world? Zenner responds, "what is great about the Catholic Church, is its robust engagement with contemporary sciences, especially since the late 20th Century. So, in *Laudate Deum*, there are lots of citations to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, these kinds of consensus documents that indicate the patterns, extent, and implications of anthropogenic climate change. I would say there's a huge relationship between the Catholic Church and science."

Beltran asks what are Catholics expected to do with this exhortation? Zenner replies, "I think it will be a resource for branches of the church and parish communities who really want to take up the call to reflect theologically and in terms of ethical action, and maybe in terms of activism. I am interested to see what happens now."

This article was taken from the interview of Christiana Zenner by Paloma Beltran on October 23, 2023, and published in the "*Living on Earth*" and featured in Earthbeat.

DID YOU KNOW?

Pierre Toussaint is on the Path to Sainthood

The Holy Family Haiti ministry was originally named after Pierre Toussaint. Toussaint, a philanthropist and founder of many Catholic charitable works, was born a slave in Haiti and was brought from Haiti to New York as an apprentice under a popular hairstylist. He became the most sought-after hairdresser in New York City. He gained his freedom, upon the death of his master, and became quite wealthy, but instead of spending lavishly on himself, he supported the church and the poor. He founded one of the first orphanages in New York and raised money for the city's first cathedral.

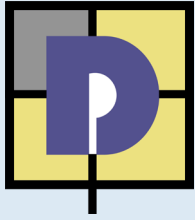

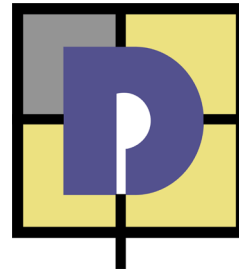
