Welcome – If you are new to our church or just visiting, we are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you would like to join our parish, registration is held in the Welcome Office after all Masses.

Wedding Policy – At least nine months before the wedding, the couple should meet with the pastor, before the wedding dates are selected. At least one member of the family should be a member of our parish.

Baptism Policy – Parents must be registered parishioners and attend a Baptism Class before their child may be baptized. Expectant mothers are encouraged to attend. The class is for parents only – baby-sitting is not provided.

Funeral Policy – Funerals are scheduled Tuesday-Saturday. We discourage funerals Sundays and Mondays. Participation by other priests and deacons must have prior approval of current pastor.

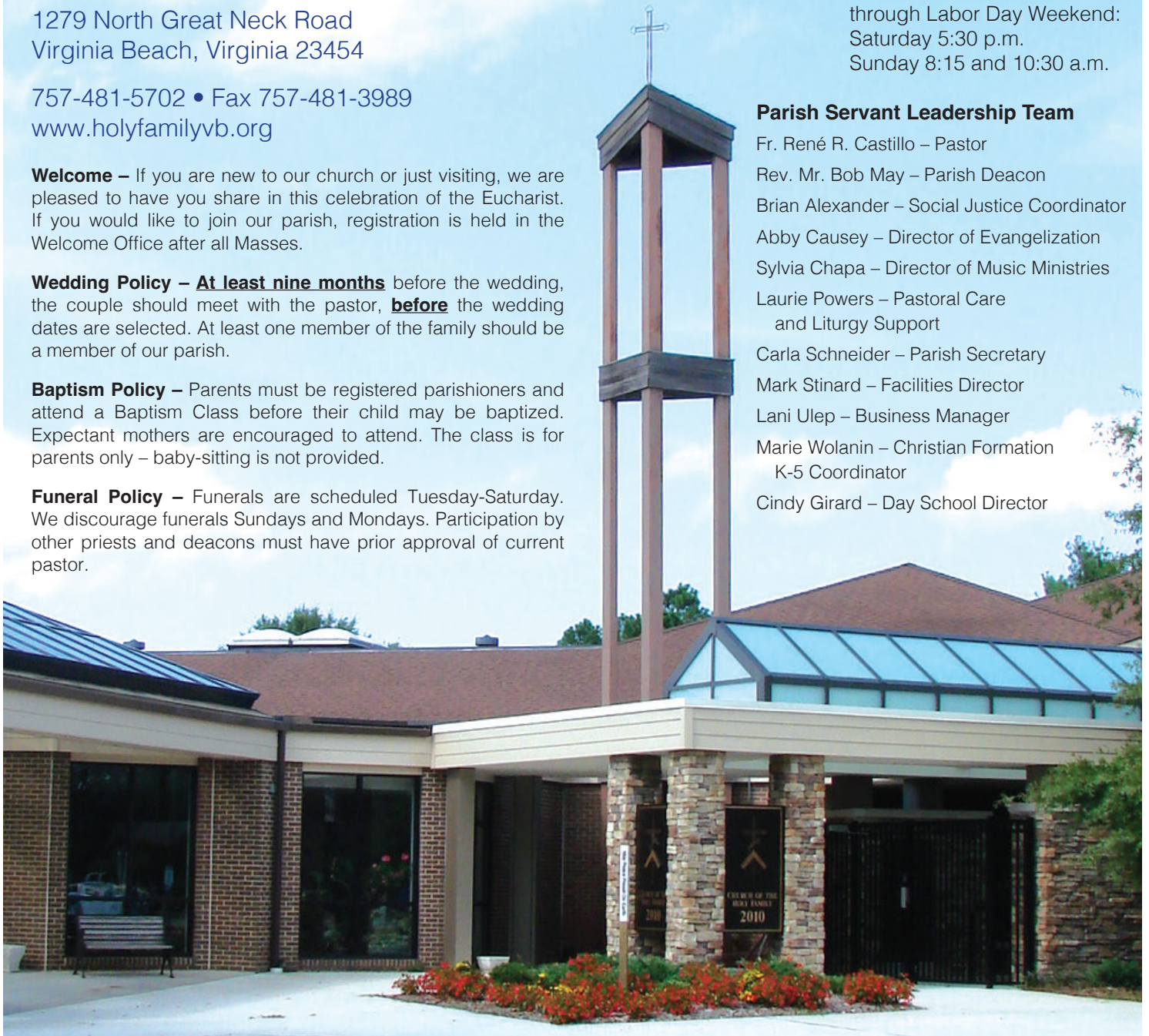

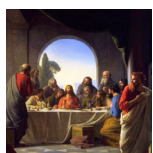

“CREATION CARE CORNER:”**Plant-Based Food – Part I**

The meat and dairy industries alone are driving the world to exceed critical levels of global warming. The rapidly growing plant-based sector could be the lifeline the planet needs! Sales of alternative food have boomed in recent years and so have investments in startups and companies developing new, more environmentally friendly proteins.

Interesting Plant-Based Food Facts:

- **Oats and soy are among the most popular ingredients used in plant-based products.** Plant-based milk alternatives have become an established item on the lists of shoppers. From soy and oat to coconut, rice, and almond milk, the selection is endless. The last of these is currently leading the market. In 2021, it reached a sales value of USD \$344 million. Along with protein-rich foods such as peas, beans, and mushrooms, one of the most common ingredients used in the production of meat substitutes is soy. Soy derivatives, such as tofu and tempeh, are commonly found in plant-based meat because of their distinctive, meat-like texture. Since the 1950s, global soybean production has increased 15-fold. Many wrongly blame the plant-based industry for the detrimental impact of soy plantations on the environment like wide-scale deforestation, soil erosion, and water contamination, when nearly 90% of the world's soybeans are fed to farm animals and only 6% is turned into soy-based products for human consumption.
- **U.S. retail sales of plant-based foods grew by 6.2% in 2021.** In 2021, unprecedented demand sparked large-scale production of new plant-based meat, seafood, eggs, and dairy substitute products, with large food companies, startups, and retailers stepping up efforts and resources to develop them. The 2021 sales in the U.S. charted impressive growth for the 3rd year in a row, increasing by 54% between 2018 and 2021.

- Those adults who have been baptized in a recognized non-Catholic Christian tradition
- Those adults who were baptized Catholic, but have not celebrated Eucharist and Communion

Participating in RCIA does not mean that you **have** to become Catholic, but it does help you to discern as to whether God is calling you to join the Catholic Church.

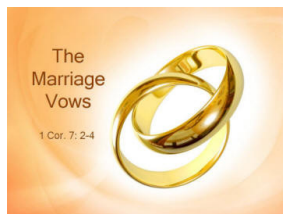

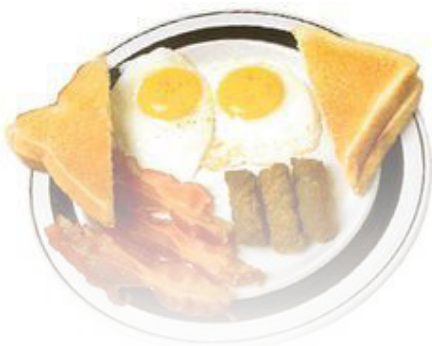

Crescent Square Apartments (CSA) is located on Diamond Spring Road in Virginia Beach. CSA is VA Supportive Housing's fifth of six development in South Hampton Roads. It has eighty single-person units. Forty-two units are for formerly homeless individuals and thirty-eight units for individuals, earning 50% or less of the area's median income. VSH offers on-site supportive services through case managers who help residents stabilize, retain their housing, and reclaim their lives. Each 360-square-foot unit has basic furnishings and a kitchenette with full-size appliances. VSH currently houses six hundred residents in their six properties. 98% of their residents do not return to homelessness.

Did you Know?

Who was the first black saint? St. Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was a Peruvian lay brother of the Dominican Order. He was canonized in 1962 by St. John XXII. He is the patron saint of mixed-race people, barbers, innkeepers, health workers, and all who seek racial harmony. He is known for his work on behalf of the poor, established an orphanage and a children's hospital. He was the illegitimate son of a Spanish nobleman and a freed slave of African descent.

How many African-American saints are there? There are no African-American saints officially recognized by the Catholic Church.

Who are the six black Catholics up for sainthood? Pierre Toussaint, Mother Mary Lange, Henriette DeLille, Augustus Tolton, Julie Greeley, and Sr. Thea Bowman.

How many Black Catholic are there in the United States? There are currently around three million Black Catholics in the United States. This is 1 percent of all Americans, 4 percent of all Catholics and 6 percent of the total population of African Americans.

Has there ever been a black or African Pope? Church records tell us there were potentially three black Popes in Catholic history. Pope Victor I (189-199), Pope Miltiades (311-314) and Pope Gelasius I who was pope from 492-496.

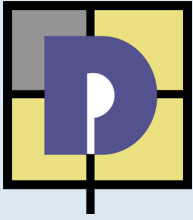
Are there any African-American Catholic Cardinals?

Wilton Daniel Gregory (born December 7, 1947) is an American prelate of the Catholic Church who has been serving as the archbishop of the Archdiocese of Washington since 2019. Pope Francis elevated him to the rank of cardinal on November 28, 2020. He is the first and only African-American cardinal.

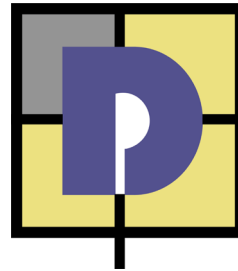
