CREATION CARE CORNER:

The 2023 UN Conference of Parties (COP28) on Climate Change takes place from November 30-December 12. This is the supreme decision-making body of the United Nations Convention on Climate Change and the summit that Pope Francis refers to in his Laudate Deum Exhortation. It will be the 28th time that nations of the world will gather to address the global climate crisis. The Conference will be held in Dubai of the United Arab Emirates, a controversial venue given that nation's status as a major oil producer.

Some 70,000 people are expected to participate: official delegations from almost all of the world's countries, many "accredited observers" including Civil Society, faith organizations, businesses (including fossil fuel companies), activists, politicians, students, military, Maryknoll missioners, and others. What will happen? Some key aspects of COP28 will be:

- **Global Stocktake:** For the first time, this inventory of exactly where we stand in regard to keeping global temperatures to a 1.5 degree rise will be presented. Exactly how far off track are we at this point, and what we need to do will be addressed.
- <u>Stakeholder Engagement:</u> Increasing inclusion of key voices, such as the indigenous, who have stewarded our planet in the right way and youth who will bear the effects of decisions.
- Exhibitions: Innovators of alternative energy solutions will rub elbows with oil companies.
- <u>Side Events:</u> The real interchange of ideas and inspirations happens here.

The Maryknoll representatives and other faith leaders have hopes for the following outcomes: Fast, full, and fair phase-out of fossil fuels; Follow-through on climate finance commitments to developed countries by mobilizing \$100 billion a year; The tripling of renewable energy; Operationalization of a loss and damage fund; Inclusion of food systems and food security in climate negotiations; Strong U.S. leadership.

This article is a draft from a two-page resource guide written by the Maryknoll Sisters and published in the Catholic Climate Covenant email in November 9, 2023.

Take the Laudate Deum Action Pledge in response to Pope Francis' call for committing yourself to urgent climate action. It consists of seven personal/family actions; two actions advocating for change within the U.S. Catholic Church and two actions advocating for systemic change at the national/global level.
