CREATION CARE CORNER:

Delegates gathering in Dubai for the opening of COP28 on November 30 approved a framework for a fund to help developing countries deal with the harm caused by global warming. The wealthier nations pledged to contribute at least \$260 million to the fund. This was a momentous achievement! Nations like the United Arab Emirates, COP28's host, and Germany each pledged \$100 million. The Biden administration agreed to provide \$17.5 million along with the other countries which made a pledge.

The World Bank was selected to be the fund's host on a 4-year interim basis, making the funds accessible to sub-national and local organizations. The framework agreed upon by the delegates from nearly 200 countries was approved in early November by the 24-member Transitional Committee, a board set up after COP27 and tasked with the operationalization of the fund. It contains recommendations on how the fund would operate, including who would receive the money and who would pay.

The delegates at Dubai also approved the agenda for the next two weeks, marking a smooth start to the summit. COP28 will also mark a historic milestone by conducting the first Global Stocktake, a comprehensive assessment that will evaluate the progress made by nations towards their climate goals.

Despite an optimistic first day for climate finance, attendees noted that key issues such as nature and biodiversity loss received little attention in the opening plenaries. Lucy Almond, Chair of Nature 4 Climate and Nature Positive Pavilion lead, said "Our natural ecosystems, which underpin our economies, are not just in trouble—they are in a state of crisis. Nature can provide one-third of the solution to climate change. It's a priority for the parties to reduce global carbon emissions, but it is equally as important to halt and reverse nature loss by 2030." The outcome of this COP looks promising!

NexTrex is making some changes



Holy Family and plastic bag recycling

In May of 2021, Josh Darrow initiated the NexTrex recycling program at Holy Family as his Eagle Scout Project. The Holy Family Environmental Ministry and the parishioners of Holy Family have kept it going. Close to 50 pounds of plastic bags are collected and repurposed

each week. Plastic bags are taken to Harris Teeter and then sent to the Trex Company. Last year 1 ¼ tons of plastic bags were collected at Holy Family. Since the start of the program, Holy Family collected enough plastic to receive four Trex benches, while keeping a lot of plastic out of the landfill and waterways.





WHAT HAS AND HAS NOT CHANGED?

- Holy Family is still collecting plastic bags. Keep bringing the bags to the bins at Holy Family.
- We are still only collecting plastic bags. This includes store bags, produce bags, ice bags, Ziploc and other storage bags, cereal box liners, bread bags, newspaper sleeves, bubble wrap and plastic table clothes. If you can stretch the plastic, it can be recycled at Trex. Do NOT place hard plastic objects in the plastic bag recycling bins.
- As always, reduce your use of plastic bags. Use reusable shopping bags, use cloth table cloths and avoid items
 over packaged in plastic.
- 1,000 pounds of plastic bags is needed to receive a bench. NexTrex now requires 1,000 pounds of plastic bags instead of 500 pounds. This has allowed NexTrex to open the program up to more schools and organizations
- You can only receive one bench per year. NexTrex is only awarding each organization one bench a year instead
 of two.
- Groups are now required to take a picture of plastic bags and include that picture when the group submits
 their plastic bag totals. This is done weekly at Holy Family.

The Holy Family Environmental Ministry could use your help.






Thank You Montego Island Grill
