AIR POLLUTION – FIRST OF TWO ARTICLES

Air pollution is one of the most dire environmental problems in the world right now. Constant exposure to it poses incredibly high risks of health issues and premature deaths to the world's population. The first step in tackling a problem is to have knowledge of the issue at hand. So, here are some breathtaking facts about air pollution.

Less than 1% of global land area has safe air pollution levels. The regions with the highest air pollution levels are Eastern and Southern Asia, followed by Northern Africa. At the other side of the spectrum are Australia and New Zealand, followed by other regions in Oceania and South America. Here, PM2.5 concentrations are the lowest, though they experienced an increase in air pollution levels over the past two decades, driven partly by intensified and prolonged wildfire seasons.

At least 1 in 10 people die from air pollution-related diseases. Air pollution is a leading risk factor for chronic health diseases and premature death. In 2017, air pollution was responsible for an estimated 5 million deaths globally, amounting to nearly 9% of the world's population. Constant exposure to polluted air increases the risk of coronary and respiratory diseases, stroke, diabetes, and lung cancer. Air pollution-related deaths in South East Asian countries accounted for 15% of deaths globally, while rich nations contributed only to 2%, according to data in 2017 demonstrating a glaring disparity between developed and developing countries.

Air Pollution is a greater threat to life expectancy than smoking, HIV, or war. Air pollution is literally cutting years from the lives of billions of people around the world. It is a rapidly rising threat in Central and West Africa, where the average life expectancy has dropped by 2 to 5 years, making it a larger threat to human health than well-known killers like HIV/AIDS and malaria.

Air pollution has a nearly \$3 trillion economic cost, equivalent to 3.3% of the world's GDP. A report released by the Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air in 2020 revealed the human and economic costs of air pollution from fossil fuels. Air pollution related deaths were estimated to have a \$2.9 trillion economic cost and was responsible for 1.8 billion days of work absences.

Climate change increases risks of wildfires and air pollution from it. Extreme weather events and wildfires have become more frequent and intense as a result of climate change. As drought seasons become more prolonged, as well as growing deforestation rates to make way for agriculture development, so do the risks of large-scale wildfires, which release carbon emissions, smog, and pollutants into the air, which can spread across countries and regions.

Participating in RCIA does not mean that you **have** to become Catholic, but it does help you discern as to whether God is calling you to join the Catholic Church.





Lessons Learned by a First Time Composter by Brian Alexander



I have been gardening for at least the past ten years. My garden has grown into ten 4ft by 4ft raised beds. Zucchini, squash, peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, basil (for pesto), herbs, onions, radishes, and milkweed (for the monarch butterflies) are grown following the guidance of Mel Bartholomew's book " Square Foot Gardening: A New Way to Garden in Less Space with Less Work".

I never ventured into the world of composting. No real reason for not composting, I just never did it. Being a retired earth science teacher, I knew the benefits of composting not only for my garden but also for the planet*. Therefore, when the Environmental Ministry at Holy Family began their composting project, I joined the team of over 40 parishioners who

became "composters". Many were first timers like me. I purchased a composting bin. A Utopia Kitchen Compost Bin for Kitchen Countertop-1.3 Gallon Compost Bucket with Lid and Filter to be exact. I also purchased compostable bags from the Holy Family Gift Shop at a cost of \$5 for 30 bags.



Here is what I learned in my three months of composting.

- 1. Composting is easy. Just place your food scraps into the bin. Once compostable bag is full, drop bag off at Holy Family in the composting bins.
- 2. My household of two people produces a considerable amount of compostable material. I never realized the amount until we started composting. On any given week, we can collect one or two 2.5-gallon bags of compostable food scraps.
- 3. I realize the need for a commercial composting facility in Virginia Beach. Imagine how much compostable waste is produced by the 450,000 citizens of Virginia Beach.
- 4. Composting is clean. I have not had any issues with flies or bugs hanging out around the kitchen compostable.

* Did you know? Composting not only makes healthier gardens and reduces landfills - it also reduces greenhouse gas emissions. Organic material in a landfill decomposes anaerobically, (without oxygen). When food breaks down without oxygen, it produces greenhouse gases (primarily methane) which escapes and accumulates in the atmosphere, contributing to global warming.

Catholic Social Teaching


On May 15, 1891, Pope Leo announced the encyclical Rerum Novarum: Rights, Duties of Capital, and Labor, which marked the beginning of modern Catholic Social Teaching. Pope Leo

was responding to the drastic changes that had occurred in the lives of working people since the industrial revolution. Many people moved to the cities, where they lived in squalor and were paid low wages for working long hours. Pope Leo was writing to propose a third way, a Catholic way, in between the two extremes of unregulated capitalism and violent communism. Pope Leo rejected the idea of inevitable class warfare, and promoted instead an ethic of solidarity, of working together. He defended the right to private property, noting however that we must "share without hesitation when others are in need" He proclaimed the dignity of work and the worker, who must be paid a living wage and be given safe working conditions and adequate days of rest. He defended the rights of workers to form associations to protect their interests, and he maintained a role for the state to intervene as necessary to secure justice for all parties. Since 1891, the Church has continued to lead the way in proclaiming how the gospel truth should be applied to our social, economic, and political lives. Many popes have elaborated on Catholic Social Teaching as the times have changed.




