Serving through Music

CREATION CARE CORNER:

According to economists like Nicholas Stem, the climate crisis is a result of multiple market failures—poor governance.

For years, economists and environmentalists have urged policymakers to increase the price of activities that emit greenhouse gases, for example through carbon taxes, which would stimulate innovations in low-carbon technologies. To cut emissions quickly and effectively enough, governments must not only massively increase funding for green innovation, but they need to adopt a range of other policies that address each of the other market failures.

A national carbon tax is currently implemented <u>in</u> 27 countries around the world. For example, a carbon tax has been effectively implemented in Sweden. The tax there is U.S. \$127 per ton and has reduced emissions by 25% since 1995, while its economy has expanded 75% in the same time period.

Another market failure that needs attention is that organizations such as the United Nations are not fit to deal with the climate crisis. Members of the UN are not mandated to comply with any suggestions or recommendations made by the UN. For example, the Paris Agreement states that countries need to reduce greenhouse gas emissions significantly so that global temperature rise is below 2C by 2100 and, ideally, under 1.5C. But signing onto it is voluntary, and there are no real repercussions for non-compliance.

And, the issue of equity remains a contentious issue. Developing countries are allowed to emit more in order to develop to the point where they can develop technologies to emit less and some countries like China are allowed to exploit this.

Our individual responsibility and part in dealing with the climate crisis is important and cannot be taken lightly. However, the major responsibility lies with our world leaders, who have the positions of influence and power to make major moves to reduce the threat of climate change and global warming.

We need to put the pressure on these leaders to take action!
