



#### **CREATION CARE CORNER:**

Coral reefs may have reached their "tipping point" and are dying off. Coral reefs are one of the oldest ecosystems in the ocean and it can take thousands of years for the full development of a coral reef from the first formation of a polyp from colonizing larvae. These complex ecosystems are among the most valuable ecosystems on the planet. Besides containing one of the most biodiverse ecosystems on Earth, they protect coastlines from damaging effects of wave action and tropical storms, they are a source of nitrogen and other nutrients for marine food chains, they assist in nitrogen and carbon fixing, and are a source of income for millions of people around the world. Coral reefs also play an important role in generating the sand and rubble that maintain islands and cays.

These extremely important ecosystems are facing unprecedented events of severe bleaching and physical destruction due to human coastal development, as well as the effects of unmanaged tourism, including anchoring, fish feeding, marine litter, and diver contact. Many scientists argue that reefs have already reached their "tipping point" and are at risk of being completely wiped out by 2050!

Can we avoid this calamity? While we have no chance but to accept that we have—to some extent, irreversibly—already changed our world, we cannot afford to let this trend continue, not just for ourselves, but for the generations to come. Sir Jonathan Ponnit, one of Britain's most respected environmentalists, writes that "our suicidal way of life is accelerating civilizational collapse." The only way we will avoid this is by drastically transforming our institutions and lifestyle. As the latest report of the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change warned, it is "now or never" to limit global warming to 1.5C.

# Notre Dame launches unprecedented University wide effort to fight poverty

#### What is Human trafficking?

- Human trafficking is a process that involves the recruitment and coercion of individuals for sexual or labor exploitation.
- Human trafficking may involve domestic and international victims. A victim does not have to cross state lines or international boundaries to fit within the definition of human trafficking.
- Some human trafficking involve remittance workers, mail order bride organizations, organ donors, and domestic workers.
- Traffickers do not come from any one socialeconomic class and are not uniform in structure.






