Grief is the conflicting feelings caused by a change or an end in a familiar pattern or behavior; it is the normal and natural reaction to loss. Our Bereavement Support Group meets Tuesdays at 2:00 p.m. in the Parish Library. If you, or someone you know is grieving, please join us. These meetings will be confidential and held in a safe environment.

CREATION CARE CORNER:

Organic matter is a crucial component of soil as it allows it to absorb carbon from the atmosphere. Plants absorb CO2 from the air naturally and effectively through photosynthesis and part of this carbon is stored in the soil as soil organic carbon (SOC). Healthy soil has a minimum of 3-6% organic matter. However, almost everywhere in the world, the content is much lower than that.

According to the United Nations, about 40% of the planet's soil is degraded. (A big job is ahead of us!) Soil degradation refers to the loss of organic matter, changes in its structural condition, and/or decline in soil fertility and it is often the result of human activities, such as traditional farming practices, including the use of toxic chemicals and pollutants. If business as usual continues through 2050, experts project that additional degradation of an area almost the size of South America will occur.

But there is more to it. If we do not change our reckless practices and step up to preserve soil health, food security for billions of people around the world will be <u>irreversibly</u> compromised, with an estimated 40% less food expected to be produced in 20 years' time despite the world's population projected to reach 9.3 billion people! Soil health is another vital issue that needs our immediate attention.

We at Holy Family Church and others have the opportunity to directly alleviate this soil problem by joining the parish compost group and bringing our food waste each week to put it in the compost bin. If interested, contact Lon Scofield at <u>scofvb@verizon.</u> net.




Catholic Social Teaching: Care for God's Creation



care for Good Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan. It is a requirement of creation. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

Laudato Si' is an encyclical of Pope Francis published in May 2015. It focuses on care for the natural environment and all people, as well as broader questions of the relationship between God, humans, and the earth. The encyclical is subtitled, "Care for Our Common Home."



Laudato Si' affirms the "very solid scientific consensus" that climate change is occurring as well as evidence that human activity is the primary driver of this warming (LS 23). The encyclical stresses that existing efforts to reduce climate change have been deeply inadequate. In turn, several ways to address the climate emergency and biodiversity crisis are outlined. These include a drastic reduction in carbon emissions and those of other greenhouse gases, the development of renewable energy sources and related storage capacity, and a transition to energy efficient methods of production and transportation. (LS 26) For example, a switch from coal and oil to solar and wind power would embody these recommendations. (LS 38)



Sacred Land: Food and Farming

Holy Family is finishing the JustFaith Program, Sacred Land: Food and Farming, which explores our connection with the land and our responsibility for it. Small groups learn how food and farming practices affect the climate crisis, marginalized communities

and their health and spiritual wellbeing. Participants read

Pope Francis' Laudato Si' and Braiding Sweetgrass by Robin Wall Kemmerer. 




