CREATION CARE CORNER:"

A major question is, "Will Climate Change Shape the Course of the 2024 Elections?" Climate change has increasingly become a prominent and critical issue gathering widespread attention and concern globally. Its impact on various aspects of society like the economy, public health, and the environment has led to increased awareness and a growing demand for action. As the urgency to address climate change grows, candidates are likely to face increasing pressure to articulate their positions and propose policies to address this critical and vital issue.

In a working paper published in June 2022, the "Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development" examined international attitudes toward climate policies by surveying over 40,000 people across 20 countries who collectively represented 72% of global carbon dioxide emissions. The study revealed that support for climate policies is dependent on three crucial factors:

- 1. The perceived effectiveness of these policies in reducing emissions.
- 2. The impact of such policies on lower-income households, particularly in terms of inequality.
- 3. Individuals' own gains and losses in relation to these policies.

As for the specific policies people want to see, it is useful to go back to the UNDF Peoples' Climate Vote Survey, which questioned its 1.2 million participants about the most important climate policies that governments should focus on to address the climate crisis.

The respondents identified conservation of forests and land, renewable energy, sustainable farming, and green businesses and jobs, the importance of which was linked to the national context. Considering the rapid increase in the frequency and intensity of weather events, the general consensus about the need for adaptation and resilience, from early warning systems to adequate infrastructure, could be expected to be included.

Headquartered in Chesapeake, Virginia, TFC employs over 400 people and operates more than 180 collection and transfer vehicles. TFC pioneered the first automated Material Recover Facility (MRF) on the East Coast and continues to revolutionize the industry with single-stream recycling which allows customers to throw plastic bottles, paper, and glass recyclables in one container. No sorting

is needed. Founded in 1973, TFC Recycling is a privately owned and family-operated business.





- All recyclables have a market and are bundled and sold. Recyclable material does not go to the landfill.
- TFC is renegotiating its contract with Virginia Beach. Their current contract is up in June.
- Do not put plastic bags in your blue recycling bin.
 Plastic bags are not recyclable and must be handpicked out of the waste stream and they clog the machinery requiring line downtime.
- The only recyclable plastic is PLASTIC BOTTLES
 regardless of their code number. Plastic bottles
 are sorted using a high-speed camera that
 recognizes the shape of the plastic and only sorts
 and recycles PLASTIC BOTTLES.
