Serving through Music

CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Prior to the Industrial Revolution and all the subsequent detrimental human activities, the global average amount of carbon dioxide was about 280 parts per million (ppm). Today, that level is close to 420 ppm. The last time carbon dioxide levels on our planet were as high as today was more than 4 million years ago. Within just 60 years or so, the annual rate of increase in atmospheric CO2 was about 100 times faster than previous natural increases.

Every ton of CO2 emissions adds to global warming. This tight correlation is highly suggestive of the fact that increasing anthropogenic greenhouse gas emissions is going to cause drastic changes in weather patterns, habitation, and biodiversity. The truth is that, in response to global warming, many of the world's ecosystems are already getting closer to catastrophic and potentially irreversible alterations. The IPCC (International Panel on Climate Change) has identified several so-called "tipping points of climate change" (defined as critical thresholds in a system that, if exceeded, can lead to irreversible consequences.) The ones that most likely will cross this century due to human activity would be:

Greenland Ice Sheet; Permafrost; Amazon Rainforest; Arctic Sea Ice; Atlantic Meridional Circulation; and Coral Reef die--off. More recent assessments have found that exceeding the 1.5C of global warming risks crossing several of these thresholds.

This is why climate scientists around the globe have long called on governments for more serious commitments to keep the global temperature rise below 1.5C. The IPPC describes this as a vital necessity if we want to avoid the devastating impact of extreme weather events in the coming decades. The Earth surface temperature has already increased by nearly 1.2C compared with the average in the period of 1850-1900 and we are on track to reach the 1.5C threshold between 2026 and 2042 in a scenario where emissions are not rapidly reduced.

The Arctic Ice Sheet is warming 3 to 4 times faster than the rest of the world, adding almost 1mm to global sea levels every year. As the 2nd largest ice sheet, the Arctic holds enough water that, if melted completely, could raise sea levels by 22 ft. At 1.5C in average temperatures could be the threshold at which the region's ice sheet melting would become irreversible.

If the above data does not stir you to concern, I don't know what will. We must do all we can to save our wonderful planet. What are you doing today?

Update of Resettlement of Family from Myanmar (Burma)



Holy Family Parishioners committed to a level three oneyear sponsorship of a family of five from Myanmar. The family is Dad, Mom, and three daughters ages 9, 6, and 19 months. The family arrived on January 31, 2024. Holy Family is working with Commonwealth Catholic Charities.

- They eat rice with every meal.

- School physicals and vaccinations were provided by the Norfolk Department of Health.
- The 9 and 6-year-old girls are enjoying attending Larchmont Elementary School.
- Dad will begin tutoring to learn English.
- The Immigration Ministry Team at Holy Family is currently pursuing a job for the Dad now that he has his work authorization card and social security card.
