Our ministry spotlight..... St. Vincent de Paul Society

The members of the St. Anne St Vincent de Paul Society would like to thank everyone for their generous support to our mission which allows us to assist members of our community with food needs. Your generous donations combined with assistance from the USDA and fundraising efforts allowed us to serve 3,063 neighbors in need over the last quarter, including 74 first time recipients and 44 emergency bags of groceries. That brings the total for the October 2018-September 2019 Fiscal year to 12,172 served.

Although there are major repairs that will need to be made to the old chapel where our food pantry now operates to get the pantry up to code, we still plan on providing special Thanksgiving and Christmas bags to those who receive assistance from us during the months of November and December. With holidays quickly approaching, we are asking that everyone consider being even more generous with your gifts of food and finances over the coming months. There is a list of special food items that we are collecting for the upcoming holiday in the back of the church.
