

Isaiah 62:1-5, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

John 2:1-11

**Brief Reflection:** The Lord has betrothed himself to us in Christ Jesus and we are not abandoned.

The wedding at Cana has Jesus at the heart of the celebration. He is present now as we gather to celebrate. Here today he bestows upon us his blessings and his gifts – bringing forth faith and reassuring us of his fidelity and abundant grace.

Next weekend, January 26 - 27, we are taking up the 2nd collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). ## A Word from Fr. James...

This weekend, we once again see the familiar green color in the vestments and other decoration in the church as we have once again returned to Ordinary Time.

Last week, we celebrated the First Sunday of Ordinary Time with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which also brought to a conclusion the celebration of Christ's birth in the Christmas season.

During these days of Ordinary Time, the focus of our Sunday readings, in particular the gospel, are on the many works and teachings of Jesus. We can make a mistake in taking the name of the season, Ordinary Time, as meaning that this time in the church is not as important as, for example, Advent and Christmas or Lent and Easter, but the word "ordinary" is referring to the numbers that mark each week.

As we return to Ordinary Time, we encounter in the gospel reading the first miracle that Jesus performs, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana. Jesus performed this miracle at the request of his mother Mary.

"The Church attaches great importance to Jesus' presence at this wedding feast. The Church sees in it the confirmation of the goodness of marriage and that thenceforth marriage is an efficacious sign of Christ's presence (CCC 1613)."

As we embark in this new season of Ordinary Time, let us pray for married couples, those that are preparing for marriage and are contemplating marriage in the future. Let us also remember those who have different struggles in their marriage, that our Lord Jesus will bless them and give them strength and may they never run out of wine.

## Un Palabra de P. Santiago...

Este fin de semana, una vez más, vemos el color verde familiar en las vestimentas y otras decoraciones en la Iglesia, ya que una vez más hemos regresado al Tiempo Ordinario.

La semana pasada celebramos el primer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario con la fiesta del bautismo del Señor, que también concluyó la celebración del nacimiento de Cristo en la época navideña.

Durante estos días del Tiempo Ordinario, el enfoque de nuestras lecturas de los domingos, en particular el evangelio, está en los muchos trabajos y enseñanzas de Jesús. Podemos cometer un error al tomar el nombre de la temporada, Tiempo Ordinario, en el sentido de que este tiempo en la Iglesia no es tan importante como es posible Adviento y Navidad o Cuaresma y Pascua, pero la palabra "ordinario" se refiere a los números que marca cada semana

Cuando regresamos al Tiempo Ordinario, nos encontramos en el evangelio leyendo el primer milagro que Jesús realiza, el cambio del agua en vino en la boda en Caná. Jesús realizó este milagro a petición de su madre María.

"La Iglesia otorga gran importancia a la presencia de Jesús en esta fiesta de bodas. La Iglesia ve en ella la confirmación de la bondad del matrimonio y que a partir de entonces el matrimonio es un signo eficaz de la presencia de Cristo (CCC 1613)".

Al embarcarnos en esta nueva temporada del Tiempo Ordinario, oremos por las parejas casadas, aquellas que se están preparando para el matrimonio y están contemplando el matrimonio en el futuro. Recordemos también a aquellos que tienen diferentes luchas en su matrimonio, que nuestro Señor Jesús los bendecirá y les dará fortaleza y hará que nunca se queden sin vino.
