"Whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out." - Jn 10:2-3

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 2:14a, 36-41, 1 Peter 2:20b-25

John 10:1-10

Brief Reflection: The Shepherd is calling us. Let us heed his voice.

Turmoil enters our lives and even enters our Church, but we are called to persevere and keep our eyes focused on the risen Christ. Through repentance and living for righteousness, we are united with him who is the heart and core of our faith. The Shepherd is calling us. Let us heed his voice.

LITURGY OF THE WORD : In the first reading, Peter tells the community that their Savior was indeed the one whom they crucified. They are *cut to the heart*, they repent, and are baptized – adding *about three thousand persons* to the community. In the second reading, Peter calls the community to patient suffering when they know what they are doing is right. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks about the shepherd and the sheep who know the sound of his voice.

Our Lady of Lourdes Statues (1985)

These statues were originally located in the walled gardens at the Monastery of the Precious Blood in Southeast Portland. When the monastery closed in 1985, these two statues were presented as a gift to The Grotto.

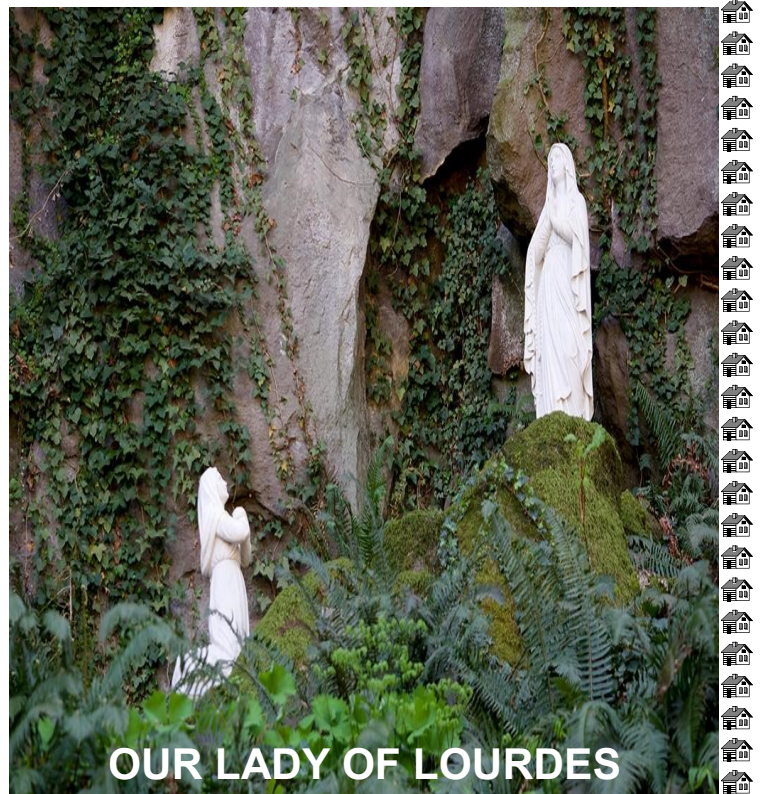
In 1858, in the grotto of Massabielle, near Lourdes in southern France, Our Lady appeared 18 times to Bernadette, a young peasant girl.

She revealed herself as the Immaculate Conception, asked that a chapel be built on the site of the vision, and told the girl to drink from the fountain in the grotto.

Not seeing a fountain, Bernadette dug at the designated spot and a spring began to flow, a flow which continues to this day.

Lourdes has become the most famous modern shrine of Our Lady.

Fr. James will begin hearing confessions

"I am going to start hearing confessions Saturday, May 2nd. Confessions will be from 3- 5 pm or until finished. I will be hearing confessions in the entry of Sacred Heart Church. People will need to line up 6 feet apart outside along the covered walk on the school side of Sacred Heart Church. One of the doors, facing 7th street will be propped open and no one has to touch the door. I will be over by the doors on the bell tower side of the church entry. There will be a screen set up. The Archdiocese has recommended that we do not have face to face confessions at this time. People will walk up to the screen. There will be no kneeler and no chair. People can simply stand there, confess and then receive counsel and penance and absolution. After will EXIT through the same propped open door they entered. I want to keep people having to touch anything to a minimum."



El P. Santiago comenzará a escuchar confesiones

"Voy a comenzar a escuchar confesiones el sábado 2 de mayo. Las confesiones serán de 3 a 5 pm o hasta que terminen. Escucharé confesiones en la entrada de la Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón. Las personas deberán alinearse a 6 pies de distancia afuera a lo largo del camino cubierto en el lado de la escuela de la Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón. Una de las puertas, que da a la calle 7, se mantendrá abierta para que nadie tenga que tocarla. Pasaré por las puertas del lado del campanario de la entrada de la iglesia. Habrá una pantalla configurada. La Arquidiócesis ha recomendado que no tengamos confesiones cara a cara en este momento. La gente se acercará a la pantalla. No habrá rodilla y silla. La gente simplemente puede quedarse allí, confesar y luego recibir consejo, penitencia y absolución. y luego puede SALIR a través de la misma puerta abierta apuntalada por la que entraron. Quiero que las personas tengan que tocar cualquier cosa al mínimo."

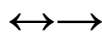

Cable/Satellite viewing of Masses

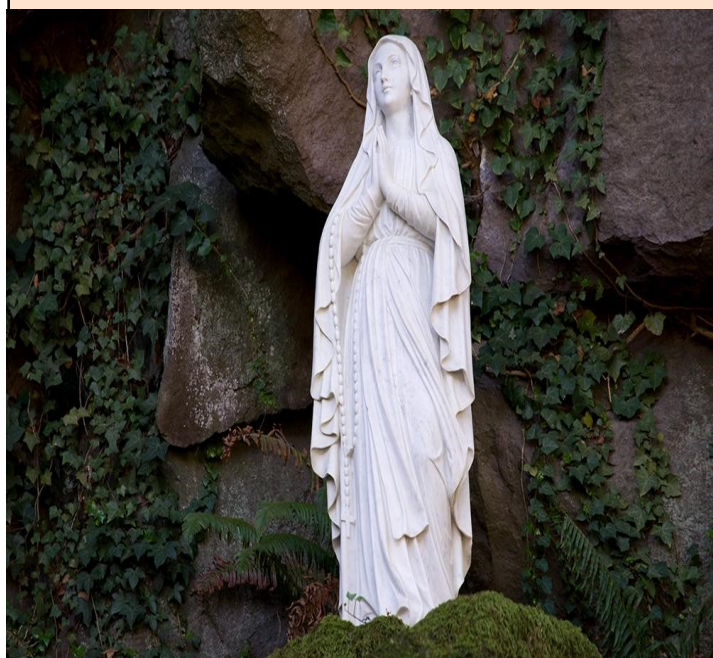

ORACIÓN POR LA COMUNIÓN ESPIRITUAL

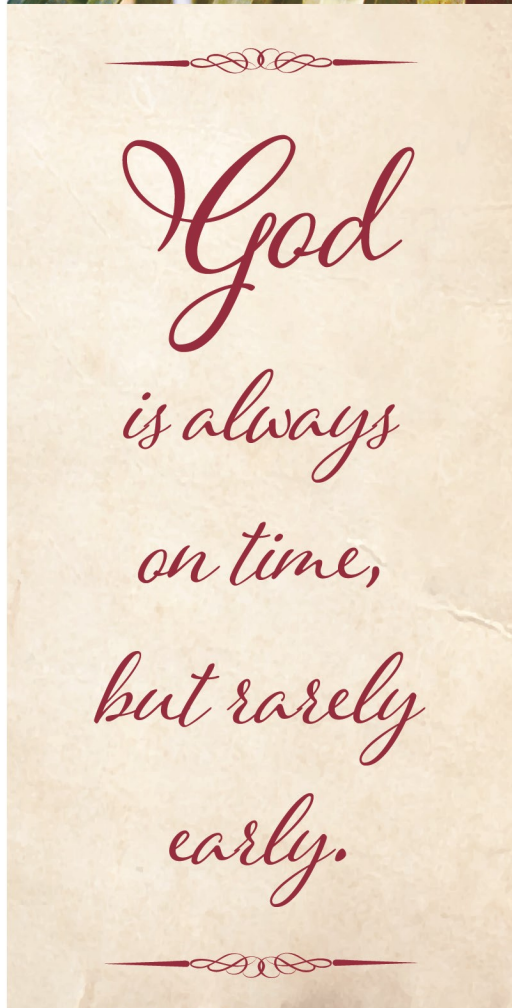
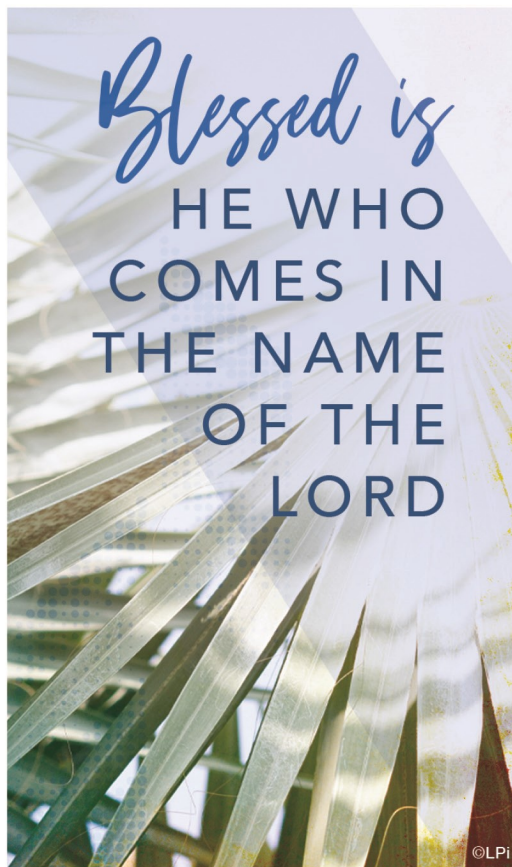
Mi Jesús,

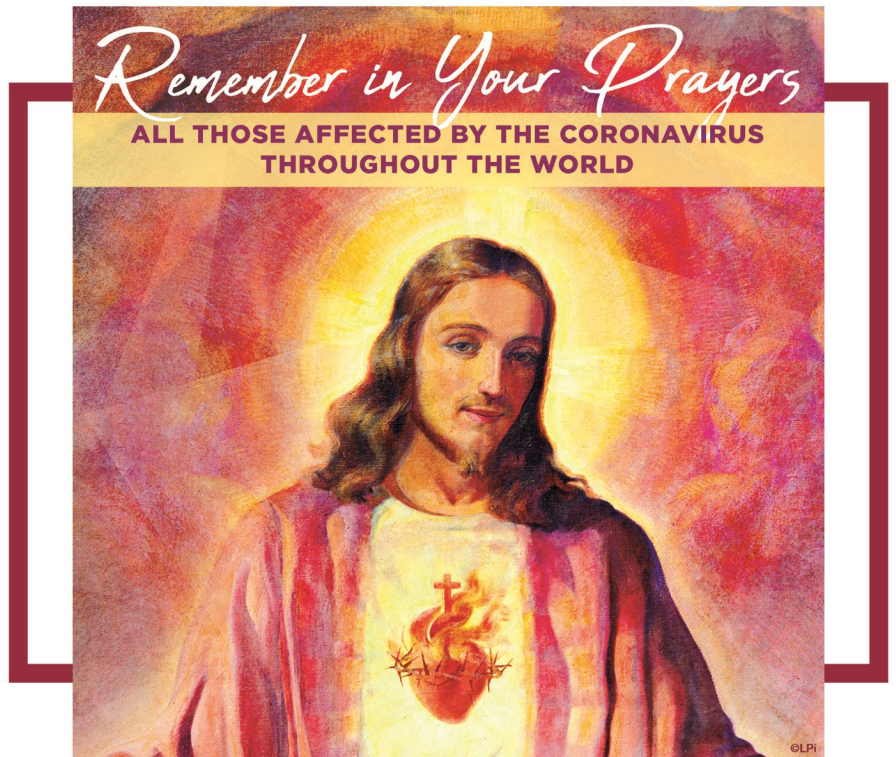

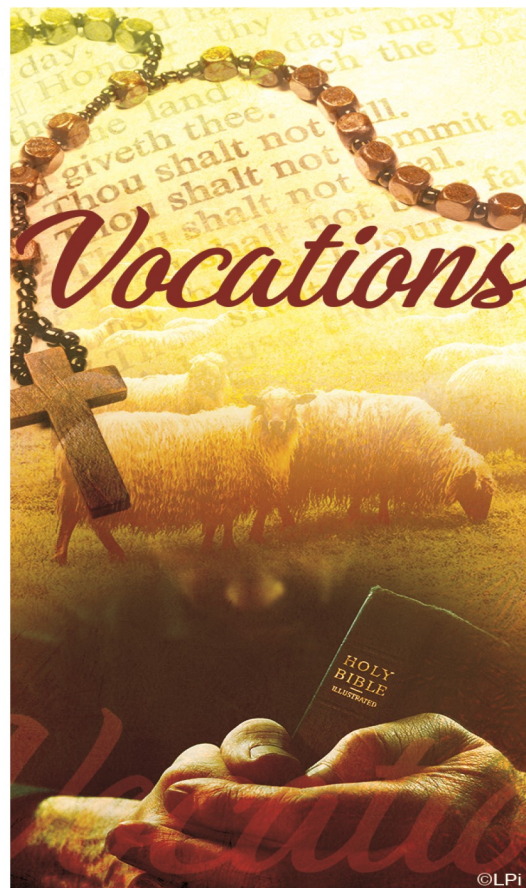

Inspiration for the week

When you wake up in the morning, whose voice is the first one you listen to? Your own? Someone else's? Or God? We all listen to someone and follow some sort of guidelines and principles. If it is a secular voice that propels us to get up in the morning and take up the task of the day's agenda, then we may find ourselves off track. The advice found in the Acts of the Apostles was as true then as it is now, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Most of what we listen to in secular voices is off the axis of truth and distorted. It may sound attractive, but it is deceptive at best. Many have gone astray like sheep and need to return to the Good Shepherd. Only Jesus can offer us the gate of life, and only Jesus as the Good Shepherd can really motivate us to take on the challenges of life. If we don't recognize his voice, we can risk facing destruction.



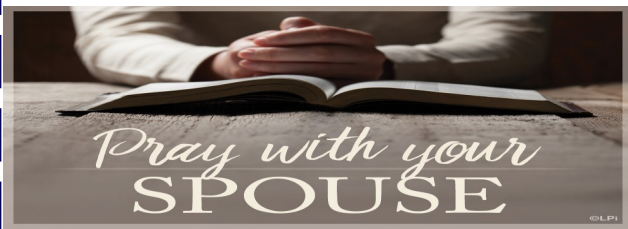

Faith in Marriage

Question: What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day? **Answer:** Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn't always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There's never "enough time" for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don't prioritize prayer, we'll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you're not already praying individually, that's a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.
