SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Isaiah 11:1-10, Romans 15:4-9, Matthew 3:1-12

Brief Reflection: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!

In the waters of baptism, we have been claimed for Christ. As we gather on this Advent Sunday, we recall and celebrate our rebirth in grace and our mission to prepare the way for the Lord. At the heart of this celebration is our repentance and our desire to be renewed with the spirit of the Lord.

A word from Fr. James

Last weekend, we began the season of Advent. This is a time that our Church gives us each year to stop our everyday tasks and to look into our hearts. We examine our hearts to shake off the drowsiness that often settles into our hearts throughout the year, so that we can be prepared when the Lord comes at Christmas. But more importantly that our Lord will find us awake and alert when he comes to call us home to heaven.

Last week, during my homily I shared that Archbishop Sample has asked the priests in our Archdiocese to preach on the Gospel message, or the Kerygma. This is the message that we have all heard in one form or another and it is what Jesus asks us to do. At the end of Mass, we are called to go in peace and proclaim the Gospel, the Good News. This is the goodness that we are to share.

On the First Sunday of Advent, I shared about God's creation of the world. There was, at one point, nothing and then God created something. He created the universe and all that is in it. He wanted to share it with someone, so he created man, Adam, in his image and likeness, and it was all good. God saw that Adam could not live alone, so he created a partner that is equal and complements man, God created Eve. Adam and Eve complemented each other and were in perfect relationship with God. Then something happened . . . The Fall of Man.

This weekend I am going to continue this message with the second dimension of the Gospel Message. The first dimension focused on creation; this second dimension will focus on the question of what the hell happened? What happened between Adam and Eve and God for a chasm to be created between God and humanity? Certainly, it started with Eve and the fruit of the tree they were not supposed to eat from, but where did the serpent come from and who is he? That question and a few more will be answered in my homily this weekend.

Finally, a reminder to you all, that this coming Thursday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

We will have a vigil Mass in Spanish on Wed., December 7th at 7 pm in Spanish and on Thurs., December 8th, we will have Mass in English at 8:00 am and Mass at 7:00 pm that same day with a bi-lingual homily. I hope to see you there as we honor Mary and her Immaculate Conception.

El pasado fin de semana comenzamos el tiempo de Adviento. Este es un tiempo que nuestra Iglesia nos regala cada año para detener nuestras tareas cotidianas y mirar dentro de nuestros corazones. Examinemos nuestro corazón para sacudirnos la somnolencia que a menudo se asienta en nuestro corazón a lo largo del año, para que podamos estar preparados cuando el Señor venga en Navidad. Pero lo más importante es que nuestro Señor nos encontrará despiertos y alertas cuando venga a llamarnos a casa en el cielo.

La semana pasada, durante mi homilía, compartí que el Arzobispo Sample ha pedido a los sacerdotes de nuestra Arquidiócesis que prediquen sobre el mensaje del Evangelio, o Kerygma. Este es el mensaje que todos hemos escuchado de una forma u otra y es lo que Jesús nos pide que hagamos. Al final de la Misa, estamos llamados a ir en paz y proclamar el Evangelio, la Buena Nueva. Esta es la bondad que debemos compartir.

El primer domingo de Adviento, compartí acerca de la creación del mundo por parte de Dios. Hubo, en un momento, nada y luego Dios creó algo. Él creó el universo y todo lo que hay en él. Quería compartirlo con alguien, entonces creó al hombre, Adán, a su imagen y semejanza, y todo fue bien. Dios vio que Adán no podía vivir solo, por lo que creó una pareja que es igual y complementa al hombre, Dios creó a Eva. Adán y Eva se complementaban y estaban en perfecta relación con Dios. Entonces sucedió algo... La caída del hombre.

Este fin de semana voy a continuar este mensaje con la segunda dimensión del Mensaje del Evangelio. La primera dimensión se centró en la creación; esta segunda dimensión se centrará en la pregunta de ¿qué diablos pasó? ¿Qué pasó entre Adán y Eva y Dios para que se creara un abismo entre Dios y la humanidad? Ciertamente, comenzó con Eva y el fruto del árbol del que se suponía que no debían comer, pero ¿de dónde vino la serpiente y quién es? Esa pregunta y algunas más serán respondidas en mi homilía este fin de semana.

Finalmente, un recordatorio para todos ustedes, que este próximo jueves es la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción.

Tendremos una misa de vigilia en español el miércoles 7 de diciembre a las 7 pm en español y el jueves 8 de diciembre tendremos misa en inglés a las 8 am y misa a las 7 pm ese mismo día con un homilía bilingüe. Espero verlos allí mientras honramos a María y su Inmaculada Concepción.
