

A word from Fr. James

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, During the month of October, the Church celebrates our Blessed Mother Mary under her title of Our Lady of the Rosary. In the past, this day has been celebrated with the name Our Lady of Victory and the Feast of the Holy Rosary. According to Dominican Tradition in 1206 when Dominic de Guzman was in France attempting to convert those that were committing heresy in the Church back to the true faith, he was not being very successful until he received a vision in which the Blessed Mother gave Dominic the rosary as a tool to fight heresies. While Mary's giving the rosary to Dominic is generally acknowledged as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the Dominican Order, including the 15th-century priest and teacher, Alanus de Rupe.

The title, Our Lady of Victory, is attributed to the victory at Lepanto that was made possible by the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary. During this time, there were other devotions made under the title of Our Lady of Victory. In places there were other military victories that have been made through the prayers and help of our blessed mother. I am sure that many of us here at Sacred Heart-St. Louis Parish have had our own blessings and victories that have been made in our lives through Mary's intercession and prayer. During this month of October, I would encourage us to take some time and pray with Our Lady and ask for her help for whatever situation you may have in your life. Maybe there is a struggle that you are having in your life or battle in overcoming a certain addiction or vice. Maybe we need to pray for victory over an illness that we are struggling with. Whatever the case may be, turn to Mary and as you contemplate Jesus and his life through these sacred Mysteries, may we be open to the grace that Jesus will pour into our lives to help us wherever we may be on our journey to heaven. Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, Durante el mes de octubre, la Iglesia celebra a nuestra Santísima Madre María bajo su advocación de Nuestra Señora de la Rosario. Antiguamente este día se celebraba con el nombre de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria y la Fiesta del Santo Rosario. Según la tradición dominicana en 1206, cuando Domingo de Guzmán estaba en Francia intentando convertir a aquellos que estaban comiendo herejía en la Iglesia a la verdadera fe, no estaba teniendo mucho éxito hasta que recibió una visión en la que la Santísima Madre le dio a Domingo el rosario. como herramienta para luchar contra las herejías. Si bien el hecho de que María le entregara el rosario a Domingo se considera generalmente una leyenda, el desarrollo de esta forma de oración le debe mucho a la Orden Dominicana. incluido el sacerdote y maestro del siglo XV, Alanus de Rupe. El título, Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, se atribuye a la victoria en Lepanto que fue posible gracias a la intercesión de nuestra Santísima Madre María. Durante esta época, se realizaron otras devociones bajo la advocación de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. En algunos lugares hubo otras victorias militares que se lograron gracias a las oraciones y la ayuda de nuestra bendita madre. Estoy seguro de que muchos de nosotros aquí en la parroquia Sagrado Corazon-San Luís hemos tenido nuestras propias bendiciones y victorias que se han logrado en nuestras vidas a través de la intercesión y oración de María. Durante este mes de octubre, me animo a tomarnos un tiempo para orar con Nuestra Señora y pedirle ayuda para cualquier situación que puedas tener en tu vida. 


Thank You! St. Joseph Parish Will Rebuild!
