God's Plan

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Saint Francis of Assisi loved Christmas. He argued that no one should fast on this holiday and that everyone should celebrate

because Christmas is an incredibly joyful event for all mankind. Of course, from a liturgical point of view, Easter is the most important holiday because we celebrate the redemption of the human race through Jesus' death on the cross and His glorious resurrection. That's true. However, let us note that if God had not become a man, had not been born in a stable in Bethlehem, and had not taken human nature as His own except for sin, then His death and resurrection would not have happened.

Christmas is a holiday that reminds us that God had a plan for humanity. It was the plan of salvation, rescue, and restoring the human race to its original dignity and participation in the Kingdom of God. God had a plan and carried it out in a distinctive way. He entered the history of man as one of us. Saint Matthew the Evangelist began his Gospel by describing the genealogy of Jesus. God did all this by participating in man's life in the most natural way for man - through the family. That is why, after Christmas, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family – this year, we will celebrate it on Friday, December 30th . Jesus did not come into the world anonymously. He became a man, a child, and a son in a particular family. Family is the basis of human life, society, and our most natural environment. That is why the family as an institution is sacred. During these holidays, we should be thankful for our families, whatever our families are because they are certainly not perfect. However, our families are the basis for us and the starting point for everything we experience. Let us thank God for our parents, let us thank God for our siblings, and let us thank God for the family environment.

Christianity is not only about churches, celebrations, and rituals. Christianity is, first and foremost, a family as God ordained it and planned it. This is also part of God's excellent plan. Father, mother, children, and the generations that preceded us that we should respect and love. One could say that Christmas reveals to us in full the essence of God's plan for man. The family is this essence because it is God's plan. Let's celebrate the family.

A look back at St. Mary's history: Did you know that Fr. Witold is not the first religious order priest to serve as pastor of St. Mary's? There were Benedictines who served at St. Mary's in the late 1800s. According to the Centennial of St. Mary's Church book from 1951. "In December of 1890, the bishop entrusted St. Mary's to the care of the Benedictine Fathers from the Abbey of St. Benedict in Achison, Kansas. The Rev. Otto Knopf, O.S.B., was the pastor during the greater part of the Benedictine stay. During his first year, Father Otto decorated the interior of the church and installed stained glass windows. In 1892 he built the present two-story school [now Schroeder Hall] at a cost of \$10,000, a monument to his energy and devotion. The other Benedictine Fathers who completed the last years of this period include Rev. Aurelius Wendell, O.S.B., Rev. Thomas Wold, O.S.B., Rev. Leopold Probst, O.S.B., Rev. Eusebius Geiger, O.S.B., and Rev. Conrad Ebert, O.S.B. The Benedictines completed their work at St. Mary's in 1894."


