The Order of the Mass

The season of Lent hopes to lead us to an authentic conversion that holds the paschal mystery at its core. The call to conversion was present among the prophets, and today Jeremiah reminds us of it. Although the apostles didn't understand at first, Jesus reminded them that this new life requires surrender, like the grain of wheat that is sown and produces good fruit. What do we take away from Jesus' own surrender, and how can we imitate it in our own lives? What do we give ourselves to: family, work, church, relationships? Both the homily and prayers today can focus on the theme of having a new heart proclaimed in the Scriptures.







