#### Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"Do not return evil for evil, or insult for insult; but, on the contrary, a blessing, because to this you were called, that you might inherit a blessing." (I Peter 3:9)

Children have a very clear sense of justice especially when it comes to siblings or friends of the same age. We all remember being annoyed if a brother or sister had more mashed potatoes or pasta in his or her dish than we did. The same applies in an argument between young children; each child feels the need to get even or one-up the other. Unfortunately adults can fall into this category also. It's called pride, one of the seven deadly or capital sins (the others being avarice (greed), envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth or acedia). We all realize we live in a very polarized society; people feel very strongly about certain issues. We are a divided country and this can also play itself out in the Church. We hear from both sides of the political aisle that the opponent should "dial down the rhetoric". I believe this is true, but we may be missing something else not often discussed among the pundits of both sides; disrespect for the individual with whom we disagree. There may be something more fundamental at work here. It seems we no longer acknowledge the true dignity of the human person beyond labels, beyond opinions, beyond political stances. We have forgotten the origin of the human person. We are all made in the image and likeness of God. We have divested ourselves of any supernatural influence: we no longer recognize the nonmaterial element. We do not live solely for this life, but more importantly for the next and this requires that we grow in virtue and holiness, overcoming our natural tendency to engage in those seven "big ones". Our culture systematically devalues the person indicated by legislation that has been passed over the past 50 or so years. Pope St. John Paul II called them "the structures of sin" because they promote sinful acts that destabilize and weaken not only the individual, but also society at-large. These policies weaken the family and make it easier and acceptable to disregard others. The individual right to act in a certain way is preferred over the common good of society. When we lose the whole (the welfare of the nation) and focus on the part (the right to do whatever we want personally) the other who doesn't agree with us is reduced to an object that must be vilified, overcome or eliminated. It's ideology over people. While there are many factors that play into the difficult national conditions that exist, it is the sin of pride that vaunts the self at the expense of the other, seeing our neighbor not as gift from God but an obstacle that will impede our goals, objectives and desires (James 4:1-6).

#### Vision 2020 Update

Stained glass window fundraising progress: We continue to make progress in the fundraising for the final phase of the window restoration. With this week's contributions we are down to \$16,411 remaining. This final phase will fully restore the large north and south arched triple bay windows in the middle of the church which are very much in need of repair. By starting the project this year we will be able to avoid \$15,000 in cost increases. We will need to notify the restoration company by August 7th of our intent to proceed pending our progress on the fundraising. We need your help to close the gap.
