#### Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"...and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Matthew 10:38-39)

I find during the summer months it more difficult to get motivated. Maybe as the weather finally improves and I'm able to get outside more I drift into "chill" mode. This summer however is different. The looming issues we face between the corona virus as well as the summer of violence no doubt have drained us physically, mentally and emotionally. Summertime can bring a laxity in the spiritual life also. This year we have to be on guard especially since our normal routine of Mass attendance, prayer and spiritual reading may have been disrupted. What may have normally been a time of weakened focus, spiritual focus has been amplified by the ongoing crises we are enduring. It's a sacrifice to make time for spiritual things, prayer, scripture study, and Mass attendance. When we are out of routine we end up reacting to events rather than directing them, especially in the spiritual life. This past Wednesday was the memorial of St. Jane Frances De Chantal. She was the founder of the Visitation Order of sisters. Under the guidance of Saint Francis de Sales she became a great proponent of works of charity, especially for the poor and sick. In one of her spiritual talks with her sisters she relayed the subject of martyrdom, but a martyrdom of love. When asked to explain this martyrdom of love she replied, "Yield yourself fully to God, and you will find out! Divine love takes its sword to the hidden recesses of our inmost soul and divides us from ourselves." She continues, "I am speaking, of course, of great souled individuals who keep nothing back for themselves, but instead are faithful in love." What the Saint speaks of here is the death of our own person, not physical death but a death to our selfishness, our narcissism, and our unwillingness to serve God in all we do. During these times of dishevelment and upheaval it is even more important not to let the sleepiness of summer or the distractions of the day keep us from our dedication to Christ and His Church and for those in our local community. Jesus tells us that if we permit our focus to be turned outwardly, following the will of God rather than pleasing the self, there will be great reward for us in the life to come, which is the goal and purpose of the Christian. We must die to self so we can live in Christ. We must crucify our desires and selfdetermination now so our soul and body can be resurrected later when this life ends. "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." (John 12:24) This Saturday, the 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At death her body saw no decay. She is the exemplar, our model for what we will become: body and soul in perfect harmony free to serve God and others in perfect self-sacrifice to God and others. She is always focused on the spiritual health of humanity, never being distracted. Her intercession is powerful and illustrates to us the importance of putting God first in all we do so He can use us to bring the Gospel, the good news of salvation to all we meet.

#### Did you know?:

Once a common element in Catholic Churches, votive candles were a way for Catholics to offer prayers for their intentions and to give witness to the power and effectiveness of their prayers by 'prolonging' their prayer through the practice of offering a prayer and lighting a candle. The idea went that the candle represented the prayer. As the candle burned, your prayer continued to be offered to God. You are encouraged to light a candle to accompany your prayers for your intentions. The large candles burn for 6 days and the small candles for 6 hours. Wooden tapers and a box filled with sand is provided. Please be very careful lighting candles and extinguishing of the tapers in the sand provided.
