#### Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites. You cleanse the outside of cup and dish, but inside they are full of plunder and selfindulgence. Blind Pharisee, cleanse first the inside of the cup, so that the outside also my be clean." (Matthew 23:25-26)

Some drivers drive their vehicles more to the shoulder attempting to keep farther away from the median. They are very comfortable hugging the shoulder of the road. I call them the "edgers". To them it's more important to keep farthest away from oncoming cars on the other side of the road. I tend to be a center driver. I hate to be too close to the shoulder. Vermont roads can be steep, winding and tricky particularly in the winter with ice and snow, so keeping far from the shoulder is more comfortable for me. I call those that drive in this manner the "mid-ers". In both cases the driver is attempting to give plenty of distance between what is perceived as a possible threat to safety. It's similar to a break that firemen create when fighting a forest fire by cutting down a swath of trees and brush to stop the raging fire from advancing. I remember once when I had switched dentists the DDS working on me for the first time noted, "You had an old fashioned dentist." I asked for clarification and he stated, "When he created a filling for you on this molar he cut away far more tooth that was necessary. It was the old way of creating a firewall to provide more space between the area of decay and healthy tissue." In the Christian's war against spiritual decay we must do the same thing. We must "drive" the Christian road with the same focus on safety. Tragically most of us are not as fo-cused on the dangers of the spiritual "roadway" or the decay of sin. The Church's tradition uses the phrase, "the near occasion of sin" to indicate the need for a spiritual firewall to put distance between us and things that can lead us to sin, even things that seem very innocuous, appearing to have no impact on our life in the Spirit. This includes visual images that entice us and start us thinking on things that are contrary to a chaste life, individuals who, although may be friendly to us live lifestyles that are at odds with Christian living, and the avoidance of spiritual disciplines such as Mass attendance, prayer, spiritual reading and fasting from something we enjoy. Instead of keeping us safe on the road, or free from decay, they draw us close to sin and its damaging effects on the soul. Remember our souls are under the influence of concupiscence, that desire that draws us toward sinful actions because they seem pleasurable and "natural". We must all come to realize that thinking leads to action. Sinful desires pop into our heads at times. If we nurture, instead of eject them immediately, sinful action is waiting to spring forward like a lion on its prey. As Christ tells the Pharisees, rotten attitudes and desires can be as detrimental as evil actions. In other words, just because we don't physically act on those desires, doesn't mean they are less harmful to the soul. This is so because any uncharitable thought is against the law of God. We need not lift a finger and still be contrary to God. That's why Jesus tells the leaders of the temple to wash the inside of the cup. He says be concerned with the spiritual motivations and attitudes first. As I've said before, "the inside and the outside must coincide" but it starts first with our thoughts and desires that may lead to sinful behavior. Avoiding the near occasion of sin means putting distance between thoughts as well as actions; staying far away from spiritual decay. It's like avoiding the edges or center of the road in the spiritual life by pushing evil thoughts and desires out of our mind and replacing them with Godly, spiritual things. As St. Paul tells us, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of peace, think about these things." (Philippians 4:8) ~Fr. Micale
