Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"The mother of Jesus and his brothers came to him but were unable to join him because of the crowd. He was told, 'Your mother and your brothers are standing outside and they wish to see you.' He said to them in reply, 'My mother and brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it." (Luke 8:19-21)

A large part of a child's life involves playing games. The best I believe are those that kids make up themselves, not because they are superior to "official" games one can buy at the store, but because it takes thought, creativity and initiation to come up with something that can be played. I fear too often children are given games to play that produce a passive rather than active mind to engage in them. To me it appears that we rob young ones from this crucial stage of cognitive development when we hand them everything on a silver platter...let them work for it. Jesus asks us to do the same thing when He speaks of the Christian life, which must be an active one. He is not playing games. He commands that we grow in the spiritual life. We must act on the knowledge we have and that is why it is so crucial to learn more and more about our Catholic faith. As St. Thomas Aquinas and the Church has taught for ages, you cannot love someone or something without knowing them first. To know what the Church teaches is to learn to love her, not to dismiss her teachings and doctrines. We are not to see the Church as optional or mutable, that is, able to change and adapt to the current human context of secular culture and belief. Therefore to make any reasoned and thoughtful decision we must be well informed. Jesus tells us that we are considered his family, brothers, sisters and mothers if we act on this knowledge and the grace He grants to us in this life. We are to apply that knowledge in all the decisions in life. There should never be a decision, no matter how grand or how small that is not based on our Catholic understanding. We are to see with the eyes of Jesus expressed through the Church. Christ is the Head of the Church. We are the Body and family members that must follow Him. We are engaged in another election cycle. Many say it is the most significant one in modern history. Politics is not for the weak hearted. It is a rough and tumble business, and that's putting it lightly. As Catholics we must separate personalities and human frailties from issues that involve the very core of humanity, "that all men and women are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with unalienable rights" because they are made in the image and likeness of God. Their right to live, to love and to serve God and their fellow man comes from He who is the author of life not from the government. St. Augustine pointed out that the Church, being the City of God, must interact and coexist with the City of Man. It is the Christian's duty to serve as the bridge, the mediator if you like, between the two worlds of the sacred and the secular. This is the ongoing struggle and challenge for those called Christian. Are we playing games with God by cozying up to the secular government just to get along and not make waves or are we willing to move beyond intrigue, that is, an effort to scheme a way to compromise on our beliefs so life is easier? Jesus tells us we are his family if we act on our Christian belief, that is, the truth of man and his relationship to God. Will we deny Him this election cycle or will we Stand Up for Jesus as the old Protestant hymn trumpets? For Our Lord tells us this, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly father." (Matthew 10:32-33) ~Fr. Micale

Religious Education Goals Fall 2020 - The goal of the Religious Education Program at St. Thomas Parish is to pass on the Catholic faith in Jesus Christ. This program recognizes the parents as the primary educators of their children, especially in the catechesis of the Catholic faith. Parents will be expected to pass on the faith we have received by helping their children with the lessons as they are presented online by our catechists, regular Mass attendance as each family deems safe, and especially in this time of anxiety about Covid-19, to practice the faith through popular piety by such means as the TV Mass, praying the Rosary, and reading the Bible as a family.

Classes for Grades K-6 will be online, with some in-person activities - Parental participation is expected especially for younger students. When attending in-person activities, each child must be accompanied by a parent/guardian, or other caring adult designated by the parent/guardian, to ensure proper safety and social distancing as required at the time of the activity in compliance with expectations expressed by the VT Dept of Health and the Diocese of Burlington.

Confirmation Grades 7-8 will be in person beginning October 11 with Fr. Chris in the parish hall. Masks are required. Registration forms and the calendar are online.
