Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"I cry out to you, Lord, I say, You are my refuge my portion In the land of the living." (Psalm 142:6)

Lately I find myself distracted by many things. Covid-19 updates, post election factions, one side for Joe Biden, the other for Donald Trump, the violence that engulfs individuals who voice a contrary opinion, the grey days of late fall and the uncertainty of things to come as we approach Thanksgiving and Christmas. When our senses are overloaded we either shut down or focus on things that will take our minds off the troubles or problems we face. Instead of addressing them head on and working through them we try to avoid these issues. It is easy to fill our lives with things that really don't profit us spiritually but at least initially calm our anxiety. One common thing that accomplishes this for us is the world of entertainment that helps us to go to "our happy place". It's a matter of tuning out and being removed from the harsh reality of life. Regardless of the difficulties we face, our focus should never stray from Christ. Yet this is difficult in the 24-hour news cycle of today. We've all heard the expression, "too much information" when we start discussing something graphic or very personal with some else. Maybe humanity is now reaching the point where there simply is too much information floating about of every political persuasion and opinion. Even if what we see and hear is true (and there's doubt about that these days) do we need to be inundated with it minute by minute hour after hour, day after day, etc.? We are a distracted people who flit from one news source to another. All this knowledge is not necessarily understanding or wisdom gained, it's just more information that can distract us rather than help us through our day. The more time spent online or watching television the less focused we are on God and the spiritual life. We have many examples of this distraction from Scripture and in particular in the Gospels: St. Peter taking his eye off of Christ and looking at the waves and the wind, the man who decides to tear down his own barn and build another bigger one when his life is about to end, the unwise virgins who forget to check to see if they had enough oil in their lamps. These examples indicate a life unfocused on the spirit and one pre-occupied with the physical, temporal life. We see from the readings as we approach the end of the liturgical year the frailty of life and the need to refocus our minds, hearts and souls on living the Gospel life of relationship with God with an eye toward heaven our ultimate end. We must acknowledge that the Church and her members are in a battle against many forces in the culture but more importantly from the forces of devil and his minions. This is why the Church was always referred to as the Church Militant because of the titanic battle it is engaged in, in every era. For the Christian the battle is as basic as being consistent with daily prayer, weekly Mass attendance and a thankful heart acknowledging all that God has given us; that He is the origin of all that is good. As we approach Thanksgiving Day, a day that reminds us that God provides, let us redouble our efforts to focus on the good God has offered us in His Son Jesus Christ. Let us be grateful for the gifts He gives us through the Holy Spirit, even with all that can discourage us these days, all that can distract us from our true goal and purpose that is eternal life; the life God the Father has prepared for us. Let us focus on developing our relationship with the Holy Trinity. One way to draw close to God is through Eucharist Adoration. During this precious time before our Savior in the Blessed Sacrament we are able to focus completely on Christ. The graces received are many depending on the individual and what God desires, but most importantly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament refocuses us spiritually and gives us the strength to carry on. Starting in Advent, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will occur at St. Thomas one hour before the 6:30 pm Mass on Tuesdays. Won't you join me in adoring the only one worth adoring, God through Jesus Christ? Despite all the difficulties we now face it is only God who is our safe haven, our tranquility amid the chaos and angst of our present society. Only He gives us peace. As Our Lord stated, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give it to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." (John 14:27) "I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (John 16:33)
