Message from Fr. Christopher Micale (reprinted from December 2017)

Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven..." (Matthew 5:3)

It's amazing to me how mankind, cut off from God, can think so contrary to His nature, reason and purpose. Let's consider this. The world around us begins to celebrate "Christmas" as soon as the turkey is consumed at Thanksgiving, yet the Church understands that the Christmas season begins at midnight on the 24th. The world sees this time as a time to "party hearty", yet the Church understands this time to be one of quiet, contemplative period, a "less is more" approach. The world goes insane over gift giving to the point of coming to blows over a particular item at a department store. It's the biggest, the best, the newest, the most expensive (how many commercials on television promote luxury cars at this time! Come on... a Lexus for Christmas?!) Yet the Church understands that Christ came to earth in poverty, simplicity and humility. The Beatitudes, the "beautiful attitudes" that we hear pronounced from Jesus' lips are all rooted in the very first beatitude, "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." It's simply in poverty of spirit, in other words, the realization that we have, of our own, nothing to offer God. That we are empty without Him; that we cannot accomplish anything of lasting value without Him, that the knowledge and the physical goods we possess amount to nothing, that the world in all its ecological, economic, political, and social chaos cannot be ordered without Him. Jesus the Christ, who was, before time, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Word through whom all exists, simply gave it all up to be with us, Emmanuel. Without this premise from which to start all else is useless, yet in essence mankind has chosen to exult itself. In essence the modern world's mantra is "all we need is a bit more time and money and we can resolve all the issues that confront us". The humility of Jesus is beyond our true comprehension, but that same humility is rooted in the Incarnation, or the taking on of our flesh, our nature. I don't know about you, but as I age I'd rather be super-human than deal with the creaks, stiffness and fatigue I feel more often than I did when I was twenty something. Yet Jesus shows His great love for us by "pitching His tent with us" and enduring all that comes with being human. It is only through poverty that we can achieve the riches of the kingdom. Our Lady's example says it all, "Behold the handmaiden of the Lord, be it unto me according to your word..." Simplicity and humility of heart, that's all it takes for God to do wondrous things as Mary's Magnificat resounds, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...He has looked with favor on His lowly servant..." In the end it comes down to one thing: the humble heart open and ready to receive the Humble King, the Lover of our souls. There's a beautiful Anglican Christmas carol that sums it all up. "What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a wise man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give him - Give my heart." (In the Bleak Midwinter, Christina G. Rossetti, Gustav Holst) O come let us adore Him, Christ the King! ~Fr. Chris
