Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"We earnestly desire each of you to demonstrate the same eagerness for the fulfillment of hope until the end so that you may not become sluggish, but imitators of those who, through faith and patience are inheriting promises." (Hebrews 6:11-12)

It's easy to get sluggish this time of year. Post Christmas. post January thaw, cold and snow starting to become a pattern, and we can all fall into a pattern of low energy. low expectations and low levels of productivity. We kind of expect this on the physical level but it can very easily happen to us spiritually. If we had been growing through Advent with the hope of Christmas to come its understandable to drift a bit in our relationship with Christ after the bluster and cacophony of the holiday season. In addition, we have all the pulls of COVID and the concerns that things are somehow out of kilter and in need of some sort of realignment. In nature the centripetal force is one that tends to impel a thing or parts of a thing toward the center of rotation. The heaviness of winter with its grey skies and chilling winds can cause us to turn inward. We must resist the "spiritual" centripetal force of the world and its answer to the hopelessness many may be experiencing. The world seeks answers and hope without the assistance of God. Yet our hope is not in politics, technology or science. Invariably these will fail us and we can easily become discouraged. Politicians do not deliver what they promised, the internet for all its benefits can be a two edged sword promoting discord and disunity, science and medicine have not found an answer to all sickness and inequities in the world. Yet our hope is always Jesus. He came to earth to give us the hope of new life not only in heaven but also here on earth. Christ encourages us to be faithful to the end. We are not to throw in the towel giving up on our relationship with God and His Church because the societal landscape looks rough and dangerous. As God's people we must carry on and persevere. In less than a month's time we begin Lent. The Church in its wisdom assigns certain liturgical seasons for a reason. The penitential times of the year, in particular the season of Lent, can re-energize our spiritual life which is apt to be drained by the pushes and pulls of this society and the piling snow. We've been through quite a year and many of our spiritual circuits have been drained. We are in need of a recharge. Let us look beyond the cold and snow to the warmth of the spiritual spring that can blossom in us if we take the time to draw close to God, seeking His answers to the problems we face rather than those of the world. Our Lord tells us to cheer up despite all the anxiety we may experience about the state of affairs in our country and the world. Jesus tells us, "In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) Jesus, I trust in you! ~Fr. Chris

The new Church lights have arrived: After 12 weeks of manufacturing the (10) new pendant lights arrived at the Church. We will be installing them over two weeks starting the week of February 1st. The new lights are about 1 foot taller than the existing lights and they will provide significantly more light in the Church. We are excited to finally be able to improve the lighting throughout the main part of the Church. The final phase of the stained glass windows restoration continues and remains on track to be reinstalled in the May timeframe. We have approximately \$5,000 more to raise to complete the project fundraising.
