Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"This people honors me with their lips but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts" (Jesus in Mark 7:6 quoting Isaiah 29:13)

Most of us have a normal routine that we follow give or take a bit here and there. We rise in the morning at the same time and go through the same actions pretty much in the same way day after day. Couple this with the grind of the cold, dark and gray days of winter and it's very easy to go on automatic pilot without much thought or introspection. As in the routine of our physical and occupational endeavors our spiritual life can pretty much fall into the same rut without much thoughtfulness occurring. In the Gospel this week Jesus calls out the Pharisees again. They are yet again criticizing Christ for not sticking to the Jewish tradition of being fastidious when it came to hygiene, especially concerning meal preparation and sanitation. The question is asked, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" Our Lord then lambastes them by pointing to their hypocrisy regarding the care of their parents. The Jews had worked up a crafty fiscal scheme to avoid using their personal resources to assist their aging mothers and fathers. By announcing that certain finances were dedicated to the temple as a sacrifice and were set-aside for this purpose, they avoided supporting mom and dad and by doing so cancelled out the Commandment to honor father and mother. Traditions can be a very good thing especially when they bring people together in love and service to each other. The tradition of preparing food baskets for the poor at Thanksgiving of Christmas is such a tradition. In addition many various cultural traditions families have at holiday time are very uplifting and serve the purpose of unity and solidarity. Yet like anything else, traditions if not purposed for the benefit of mankind, can become millstones around the neck that prevent us from acting out the true goal of love and service to God and neighbor. The Pharisees created their own traditions, in fact hundreds of laws that burdened the Jewish people, creating a barrier between them and God rather than bringing them in closer relationship with Him. This is what Christ is speaking to when He talks about the traditions or human precepts that are used to control and manipulate rather than increasing the flourishing of the person both physically and spiritually. As we approach the penitential season of Lent we will engage in the discipline acts of fasting, prayer and almsgiving. While these are greatly beneficial to our spiritual growth and development they must be directed toward the true end of all our actions, attitudes and thought processes; that is strengthening of our relationship with the Holy Trinity. If our goal becomes focused on losing weight by not eating chocolate and dessert (however good that may be) we have missed the point entirely. Let us enter Lent with the right attitude of drawing closer to God in every way so that at Easter time we will have grown in our love and service to our Creator and our fellow citizens, those of the Kingdom of Heaven as well as citizens of our nation and local community.
