Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"And God saw everything that he had made and behold, it was very good." (Genesis 1:31a)

I have often heard from individuals this popular declaration: "I'm spiritual but not religious" meaning the person is not into formalized approaches to religion. The indication is that they can find God anywhere they don't need to go to a church building, that the person is not limited to the material world that his or her enlightenment comes detached from the physical reality in which he or she lives. There was an ancient heresy that infected the Church many centuries ago called Gnosticism. This error held that a small segment of the general population was superior and spiritually enlightened above the rest. There was a dualism in their understanding espousing the belief that the universe was of two dimensions, the material and the spiritual. The goal was to attain spiritual acumen at the detriment of the physical. Therefore the two realms were opposing. What evolved was the labeling of the physical as evil and the spiritual as the good. To be enlightened spiritually was the goal, the physical was of no use. Therefore the physical, in particular the body it was of no importance. Coming to our time in history we must avoid the new Gnosticism or dualism about the physical and the spiritual. In the book of Genesis we see that God created the material world and said it was good. The physical world is not evil. The real problem lies in how we use the material because everything God creates is good. So it is in the Christian life. The Catholic understanding emphasizes the goodness of physical things through the sacramental life of the Church. The sacraments utilize physical elements, such as bread and wine, to convey the spiritual. Behind the physical object we visibly see is a greater spiritual reality, thus the importance of both physical and spiritual working in harmony to transmit the grace of God to each and every one of us. God created mankind as a composite being consisting of both the physical body and the spirit therefore the sacraments are uniquely created by Jesus Christ to coincide with this reality. This is why it was so important for Catholic churches to be reopened during the pandemic. Catholics are a sacramental people. We need the sacraments to grow in grace and holiness. For many Christians the spirit is emphasized over the physical and meeting together becomes less of an issue, thus many places of worship still remain closed. Catholics understand that although prayer and a relationship with God can occur outside a public worship service it is through the union of the physical and spiritual, both the physical community as well as the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist at Mass, that we come into true communion with God and the saints in heaven. Being alone on a mountaintop might make us feel connected to God in a special way but feelings are slippery things that change depending on our moods; they are not good barometers of our spiritual condition. Understanding the goodness of the physical and its connection to the spirit helps us to see the importance of being at Mass on Sunday, for there is no substitute no matter how "spiritual" we may think we are.
