Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48)

I suffer from a virulent strain of perfectionism. It's been a tough battle through the years attempting to tackle this virus. The perfectionism I speak of has to do with actions and tasks. To do something I have to make sure it's done to the nth degree whatever that means to me at any given time. When I fry eggs over light I want the egg yolks to be soft but not too runny, the white of the egg must be of the right consistency too. We could address other areas of life but the gist of the matter is that doing something means doing something to the highest degree. So what's wrong with that? The Book of Ecclesiastes tells us, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might; for there is no work of thought or knowledge or wisdom in Sheol, to which you are going." (Ecclesiastes 9:10) Our Lord commands us to be perfect, yet what does He really mean - to make sure everything we do is perfectly accomplished? Christ could hardly expect us to be perfectionists. Doing something for the sake of doing it "perfectly" without flaw is counterproductive to the Christian life because none of us can achieve this, it's impossible; something always goes wrong. We have been made in the image and likeness of God and retain that dignity to a certain degree (we are not totally corrupt as some non-Catholic Christians have though over the centuries). Yet as humans we are inherently flawed because of sin. Jesus tells us that the root of the problem comes from within and does not originate externally (Matthew 15:11). God is offended by sinful acts but His focus is on where they are born, in the heart and imagination of the person. To be perfect for God is not cooking eggs a certain way but by reaching the goal or end He has for each and every one of us. It is accomplishing the very reason for our existence, first for the vocation we have on this earth and secondly and most importantly, to enjoy His presence in eternity. When something is perfect it does exactly what God had designed it to do. Birds who fly are perfect because God created them for that purpose. Those poor creatures that are disabled in someway and can't fly because of defects are imperfect, unable to accomplish the end that the Creator meant for it. So it is with the human person. When we commit sinful acts they offend God because as a loving Father He sees we are choosing to be less than He wants us to be. Parents want what is best for their children and when they undercut their potential it saddens them. Christ wants us to flourish in this life but His focus is not on the actual tasks or activities we engage in. He wants us to be perfect by accomplishing His will for us: holiness in this life and pure communion with Him in the next. So stop worrying about whether the eggs are cooked just right and focus on being perfect in the true sense. Let's permit God to overcome our sinful motivations and attitudes that lead us to sin and fall short of His purpose for us and so strengthen our relationship with the Blessed Trinity and with others, always seeking the will of our Father in heaven. ~Fr.
