Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen my king from among his sons." (I Samuel 16:b) "Then Jesus said, 'I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do no see might see..." (John 9:30a)

You may have noticed past Sunday that the readings used were not the ones that are indicated for the third Sunday in Lent, and neither will they be for the next two Sundays. For the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays the readings for Cycle A are proclaimed. They are special texts that relate to the entrance of those individuals seeking to be received into the Catholic Church. The first reading this Sunday from the Book of I Samuel speaks of God's prerogative in choosing those with whom He wants to have a special relationship. For the Catechumen or Candidate this is especially meaningful for God calls all to repentance "who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (I Timothy 2:4) The Gospel readings involve the conversion of three persons. who represent the Catechumen or Candidate for reception in the Body of Christ: the outsider, the non-Jewish person or those outside the Catholic Church, the man born blind who finally sees or has a conversion and now sees all things through a spiritual lens, and the raising of Lazarus symbolizing the hope of the resurrection not only after death but to the non-believer who comes to believe and upon reception of the sacraments lives a life renewed from spiritual death in Christ. In addition to these readings a part of the liturgy for Sunday Mass is the Rite Belonging to the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. They are "...meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect: to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good." (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, no.141) St. Mary's parish is blessed to have a candidate for full reception into the Catholic Church who has been studying over the past year. At the Easter Vigil at St. Thomas Church she will receive the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. So, while it may appear things are confused with the readings at Mass these next couple of weeks, know that for this year they all represent the beautiful journey of the Catechumen (those previously not baptized) and Candidate (those baptized validly outside the Catholic faith) who have come to believe that Jesus is the Christ and that the fullness of the truth resides in the Holy Roman Catholic Church.
