#### Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

"Now on the first day of the week Mary of Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran, and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb...Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; For they did not know the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead..." (John 20: 1-3,8-9)

Every year in Northern New England I pant for the spring; which really never comes. Oh we have four seasons all right but one of them is mud season, which replaces spring. No sooner have we rid ourselves of snow and the forecast for the next day is snow up to 6 or so inches! Yet as depressing that might be we do realize that warm weather will arrive and the end of frost, snow and ice will eventually happen. Despite the delay there is always a renewal of the earth, a regeneration of things in a definite order. Crocuses appear first followed by daffodils and tulips then the glory of lilacs later on in June. We hope and are assured of the re-growth of the natural world. The earth is quite regular with its cycle of seasons and growth. Do we realize or ponder that in the spiritual life Christ expects us to cycle also? Being both of the earth (our physical bodies) and of God, made in His image and likeness (spirit/soul) we must pass through different seasons or cycles of death and life ending in life everlasting as we follow Christ on earth now. Do we really believe in the resurrection of the dead? It is our faith and our hope. We have been given a great gift in the Church by her instruction and Gospel truth handed down for two thousand years. The Church clearly teaches the resurrection of the body. At the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday the disciples were confused on this profound truth. Mary Magdalene is frantic when she reaches the tomb. When St. Peter arrives it seems he is left scratching his head. It appears St. John was the one who at first glance in the empty tomb believed that Jesus had risen from the dead. Three and a half years side by side with Jesus speaking of His death and resurrection and it looks like only John (and undoubtedly Our Lady) understood. St. Paul tells us, "Now if Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain...If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all men most to be pitied." (I Corinthians 15:12-14,19) In other words if we do not believe we will rise at the resurrection than what's the point of all of this? If this life is all we have then we should please our natural bodies in every way and become focused on its protection. The world has become so focused on the saving of the physical body the spirit or soul is neglected. Many are becoming convinced that there is no spirit in mankind and no afterlife. As Christians we must never fall prey to the worldly over focus on the physical body and this physical life. We are to care for our bodies as well as the earth as best we can but we will never conquer death outside the sacrifice of Christ on the cross and our full acceptance of Him into our lives. Sin entered the world and so did sickness and death. We will never live forever on this earth no matter how much humans attempt to create a "super human" and extend our lifespan. Christ entered the world and brings us life eternal if we maintain the proper order of existence: the spiritual life first and foremost and then the respect and care of the physical, putting God first in all we do everyday and submitting to the Father's will.
