Message from Fr. Christopher Micale "Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:13)

"Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God.

All the works of My hands are crowned with mercy."

(No. 301 of St. Faustina's Diary)

Not everyone in the Seminary studying for the priesthood is diligent in his studies. We all have different temperaments. Some can sit for hours focusing on philosophy and theology. Others cannot. Some have the knack for studying some do not. For about three or four years of my six-year formation at the seminary one seminarian in particular tapped into my Sicilian temper. Not being the most diligent student he had a strategy when examination time rolled around. The night before the test he would visit the rooms of those seminarians who were invested in the class and had done the required reading and "tap into" their insight, drawing out their understanding of the subject at hand like sipping soda from a straw. I was furious when he first attempted this. Who did he think he was, trying to take all the knowledge and "wisdom" I developed and worked so hard for during the semester without lifting a finger to do the work himself? Despite all the "wisdom" I had, I made up for it by my lack of love for this poor soul. What a pigheaded egotistical so and so I was! It finally dawned on me that maybe this "not ready for prime time" seminarian had a learning disability and that the best way for him to learn was through discussion one on one with someone who understood the material. I kicked my pride down the hall and started assisting him, along with others, and he made it through to his very last year. He eventually discerned a different calling and he is now married and I believe has a child. This Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday, instituted by Pope St. John Paul II. Why did Jesus go to such lengths to reveal the Divine Mercy to St. Faustina? "The Lord said to me, 'The loss of each soul plunges Me into mortal sadness. You always console Me when you pray for sinners. The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion of sinners. Know, My daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered." (No. 1397) Let's not kid ourselves by believing we do not sin and are not in need of God's mercy. For to do so is to make us guilty of a far worse a sin called presumption or an attitude of trusting in ourselves without recognizing that salvation comes from God. (Catechism of Catholic Church #2092) I hope you will attend the Divine Mercy Chaplet this Sun-Confessions will be available and God's mercy abundant: for priests and parishioners alike.
