Message from Fr. Christopher Micale

'Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." (Luke 22:19)

This past Monday we celebrated Memorial Day or Decoration Day, as it was first known. It started originally by Civil War widows who gathered to the gravesites of their fallen husbands and placed wreaths or flowers in remembrance of their sacrifice to their country. Although the holiday can be associated with a day off from work and chance to enjoy a hamburger or hot dog we must never forget those who gave their all, their very lives for the freedom of others. This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi or the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ who sacrificed His life for our spiritual freedom from sin. Christ's sacrifice at Calvary becomes present to us. We not only remember Jesus, we experience His presence before us. We are not honoring the memory of a fallen hero who no longer lives. Christ's actual sacrifice is re-presented to us. Jesus who is beyond time and space, the eternal God who was ever living, having no beginning or end, is past, present and future. God sees it all, He is not limited to any specific time period. Therefore Christ is with us substantially, meaning the very reality of Christ, who He is now, in His glorified body. Please note, and this is essential to the understanding of the Holy Eucharist: The wine and bread we receive at mass are NOT a symbol of Jesus' sacrifice. Christ wants us to become more and more like Him, to enter into true communion with Him. When we receive Him we are changed more into Him, He does not become a part of us. A symbolic gesture is nice, like reenacting a scene from history, but Christ wants us to experience Him in this very personal and profound way. Do we truly appreciate what happens every Sunday at mass? Do we approach the King of all nations, the very Second Person of the Blessed Trinity in a manner of respect and great reverence? "Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself." (1 Corinthians 11:27-29) Recently we celebrated the Feast of the Visitation (May 31), when Mary travelled to see Elizabeth her relative. St. Elizabeth greets Our Lady with these words, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." (Luke 1:42-45) Do we believe in Christ's real presence reserved in the tabernacle at church, as Mary was the "tabernacle" when she carried Jesus in her womb? Does our heart rejoice coming into his presence? Our gestures, postures and demeanor at Mass must reflect the seriousness of this sacred moment when Christ comes to us. We must present ourselves at Communion in a most reverent and grateful manner with a focused will, an intention to properly honor the "fallen hero" who lives forever and who wants us to live with Him for all eternity.

Changes at Mass Due to COVID-19 Restrictions

5-Day Directed Retreat

The Society of St. Edmund will be conducting a 5-Day Directed Retreat in the Ignatian tradition from Sunday June 20 to Friday June 25, 2021 at St. Anne's Shrine in Isle La Motte. Using principles from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, retreatants are invited to contemplate scripture passages in a silent environment, celebrate daily Eucharist and meet with a Spiritual Director each day. Applicants should be comfortable maintaining an atmosphere of silence and be able to share their prayer experience with a Spiritual Director in a daily meeting of about forty-five minutes. Space is limited and all participants are required to follow the State of Vermont COVID-19 guidelines regarding travel protocols for fully vaccinated and non-vaccinated persons.

Rosary Relay

On the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 11), the Diocese of Burlington will be participating in a worldwide Rosary Relay led by Bishop Coyne at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Burlington. In 2002 Pope John Paul II announced the Annual World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests to be held on the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The first global Rosary relay was launched in 2009 and has been an annual event since. This relay serves as a gift from the laity to our wonderful priests to show our love and appreciation. Beginning at midnight on Friday, June 11th, various locations from over 100 different countries will start praying the Rosary at every half hour, passing it along to the next location until finally the entire world will be encircled in the Rosary just before midnight of the next day. The Diocese of Burlington will be receiving the relay from the St. Dominic Priory at Our Lady of the Rosary in Haverstock Hill London, where we will say the Sorrowful Mysteries and then we will send it on to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine in Euclid, Ohio.
