The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, September 8

The origin of this Feast is fought in Palestine. It goes back to the consecration of a church in Jerusalem, which tradition identifies as that of the present basilica of St. Ann. The Birth of Mary has been assigned to September 8 both in the East and the West, but in ancient times it was celebrated on different dates from place to place.

The Blessed Virgin Mary had a singular mission in the History of Salvation. The birth of the Blessed Virgin is in direct relationship with the coming of the Savior of the world. Thus, the birth and existence of Mary takes on a significance that transcends her own person. It is explained solely in the context of the History of Salvation, connected with the People of God of the Old Covenant and the New. Mary's birth lies at the confluence of the two Testaments - bringing to an end the stage of expectation and the promises and inaugurating the new times of grace and salvation in Jesus Christ.

Mary, the Daughter of Zion and personification of Israel, is the last and most worthy representative of the People of the Old Covenant but at the same time she is "the hope and the dawn of the whole world." With her, the elevated Daughter of Zion, after a long expectation of the promises, the times are fulfilled and a new [divine plan] is established (LG 55).

The birth of Mary is determined in particular toward her mission as Mother of the Savior. Her existence is intimately connected with that of Christ: it partakes of a unique plan of predestination and grace. God's mysterious plan regarding the incarnation of the Word embraces also the Virgin who is His Mother. In this way, the Birth of Mary is at the very heart of the History of Salvation.

The Biblical readings of the Feast have a clear intention that forms the backdrop for contemplating the figure of Mary.

The virginity stressed by the Gospel text is the sign of the Divine origin of the Son and of the absolute newness that now comes forth in the history of human beings.

Joy pervades the whole of this Feast's liturgy. Much joy is stirred up by the birth of the Mother of the Savior. This is a Feast that serves as a prelude to the "joy to all people" brought about by the Birth of the Son of God at Christmas and expressed by the singing of hymns and carols.

Added to this theme of joy on this Marian Feast is that of light because with Mary's birth the darkness is dispersed, and there rises in the world the dawn that announces the Sun of Justice, Christ the Lord.

Instead we will have Mass on Friday morning at 8:00 AM with Adoration on the First Friday of each month, following the Mass. The Tuesday Mass time is unchanged. 




