The Meaning of the Advent Wreath

Advent is a time of expectation and hope filled with rich traditions. "Advent" means "arrival" or "coming," and it prompts us to pause each day in December and remember why Jesus came at Christmas. A common way of commemorating Jesus' birth is through an Advent wreath and candles. Advent tradition should help families remember why we celebrate Christmas. The Advent wreath and candles provide beautiful symbolism for each week of advent as we wait for Christmas to arrive.

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming." Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. The Advent season not only symbolizes the waiting for Christ's birth but also for his final return.

The Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839. In time a tradition developed of making the Advent wreath out of evergreens to symbolize everlasting life in the midst of winter and death as the evergreen is continuously green. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. The Advent wreath is a symbol of the season, with a candle lit each of the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Day. The light of the candles reminds us who Jesus is: "In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:4-5). Advent candles are often nestled in the evergreen wreath. Sometimes, decorations like holly and berries, are added. Their red color points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death on the cross, shedding his blood for our sins. Pinecones can symbolize the new life that Jesus brings through His resurrection. Families begin lighting a candle on the First Sunday of Advent, and they light another candle each subsequent Sunday. Each candle represents something different. The first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rosecolored.

The **first candle** symbolizes hope and is called the "Prophet's Candle." The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival. The purple color symbolizes royalty, repentance, and fasting.

The **second candle** represents faith and is called "Bethlehem's Candle." Micah had foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, which is also the birthplace of King David. The second candle is also purple to symbolism preparation for the coming king.

The **third candle** symbolizes joy and is called the "Shepherd's Candle." To the shepherd's great joy, the angels announced that Jesus came for humble, unimportant people like them, too. In liturgy, the color rose signifies joy. This candle is colored pink to represent joyfulness and rejoicing.

The **fourth candle** represents peace and is called the "Angel's Candle." The angels announced that Jesus came to bring peace--He came to bring people close to God and to each other again. This color is also purple to represent the culmination of love through the Messiah.

We have arrived at the Third Sunday of Advent and the lighting of the "Shepherd's Candle" of great joy. Join us in sharing the joy of expectation in the parish hall on Sunday as we assemble the Christmas Food and Fruit Baskets for needy families after Mass, share friendships and treats, and sing some Christmas carols. We hope to see you there!

Christmas Food and Fruit Baskets




