Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary – March 19

The seven joys and the seven sorrows of St. Joseph, based on various events in the Bible, as recorded in the 19th-century devotional book "The Glories of the Catholic Church"

The Seven Joys

- 1. The angel sent from heaven to console Joseph in these words: 'Joseph, Son of David, fear not to take Mary thy wife, for what is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit.' (Mt.1: 20)
- 2. The tidings of great joy brought by an angel to the shepherds, that a Savior was born in the city of David, while a multitude of the heavenly army was praising God, and saying, 'Glory be to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men of good will.' (Lk 2: 10, 13, 14)
- 3. Giving the child the name of Jesus, 'which was called by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.' (Lk 2: 21)
- 4. When he saw the wise men from the east come to pay their homage to the new-born King, 'and falling down they adored Him, and opening their treasures they offered Him gifts, gold, frankincense and myrrh.' (Mt 2: 1,2,11)
- 5. When he heard in the temple from the lips of holy Simeon, that the child was to be 'the resurrection of many in Israel.' (Lk 2: 34)
- 6. In the land of Egypt, when he heard from the angel that 'they were dead that sought the life of the child, and that he might return with safety into the land of Israel.' (Mt 2 20)
- 7. The finding of Christ in the temple, disputing in the midst of the doctors, after sorrowing for Him three days. (Lk 2: 46)

The Seven Sorrows

- 1. Finding that his honored Lady and amiable spouse had conceived, and at the idea of being obliged by the law to forsake her. (Mt 1: 18, 19)
- 2. Not being able to find lodging in the city of Bethlehem for the King and Queen of heaven, and at seeing Jesus lying shivering on a little straw in a manger, between two animals—His only shelter from the cold, there being no room for Him in the inn. (Lk 2: 7)
- 3. Seeing the divine infant suffer and shed so much of His precious blood in the painful ceremony of His circumcision, when he was but eight days old. (Lk 2:21)
- 4. Hearing, on the day of the purification, the prophecy of holy Simeon, that the child should be an object of contradiction and persecution, and that a sword of sorrow should pierce Mary's heart. (Lk 2:34-35)
- 5. His flight into Egypt with the child and His Mother, in the darkness of the night, and in the depth of winter, to escape the persecution raised by Herod against the adorable infant. (Mt 2: 13)
- 6. On his return from Egypt, hearing that Archelaus, crueler still, reigned in Judea on the throne of Herod his father, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in sleep retired into Galilee. (Mt 2: 22)
- 7. In the celebrated pilgrimage to Jerusalem, not finding the child Jesus, his only solace, among his acquaintance, he sought Him three days, sorrowing for His loss. (Luke 1: 45, 46, 48)

Tickets are \$15 for this traditional Irish dinner, and will consist of Corned Beef and Cabbage, boiled potatoes, carrots and dessert. Please purchase your tickets after Mass.

Finance Update:

As we have all been experiencing the cost of fuel oil has gone up dramatically. When we did the 2021-2022 budget we increased the fuel oil budget by 15%. We receive fuel deliveries regularly and during the heating season we receive fuel oil every couple of weeks. For our most recent bill the price per gallon has increased to over \$4/gallon and we expect the increases will continue. Based on our current forecast for the remainder of the fiscal year we are expecting that we will exceed last year's cost by 60% which far exceeds our budget plan. We continue to manage costs to work through this challenging time to help offset the increased oil expense but wanted to make the Parishioners aware. Please prayerfully consider adding to your offertory contributions over the coming weeks and months. Every little bit helps and we appreciate your generosity and support.

Vision 2020 Update:

We are finally going to start the handicap bathroom renovation beginning the week of March 21st, 2022. There have been many challenges working through COVID impacts, contractors schedules and supply chain challenges, however, we are finally ready to go. The original project costs did increase by about 18% overall. We identified some heating issues which made the ladies room very cold, and these issues will be corrected during the renovation. Both restrooms will be closed for 2-3 weeks but we will make the rectory bathrooms assessable during Mass times. The renovation will change the current men's room into a fully ADA accessible restroom and the ladies room will be redone with new walls, toilets, ceiling, lights, sinks and mirrors. The hallway in front of the restrooms will also be redone with sheetrock walls, new ceiling and lighting to make it a much brighter space. New heating will also be installed that will have zones to properly manage the heating for each of the renovated areas. This was another key Vision 2020 project that we were planning to do, and we are pleased that we are finally able to get it started. We will keep you posted on how the project is progressing.

A Closer Look at Vermont's Proposed Constitutional Amendment, Article 22. St. John Viannev Parish, in S. 




