

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reflections:



Love is the most powerful thing in the universe.

Love can turn the most insurmountable mountain into a pile of rubble. Well, some may say, hate can do that. A hate filled missile can also bring down a mountain. This is true, but love can do something that hate will never be able to - love can restore! Love can plant seeds of redemption and provide enough nourishment to sustain for ages. Hate just destroys and destroys and destroys 'til nothing is left except hate and darkness.

Love can be hard, yes. I think love can get easier the more we know about ourselves. I encourage all of us to get to know who we are at our core. Maybe some of us have been in therapy but, for those of us who haven't, I think we all could benefit from some sort of therapy, group therapy, AA, family counseling or some small group faith formation of some kind. The more we know about what makes us tick, the better we can respond to Jesus' teaching.

If someone comes up to you and says that your hair looks like a dead octopus or has some other hurtful comment, one immediate reaction could be to say something equally critical or cruel. However, the person who knows themselves deeply will be mindful of the fact that they are ok with who they are and that no shallow criticism can change that. Moreover, someone who knows themselves will probably understand that, the critic who made the hurtful comment, most likely has been criticized themselves many times before and is still carrying the hurt around with them, tossing it at other people in an effort to deal with their own insecurity.

To me, when we know ourselves and have a certain level of Emotional Intelligence, we see our flaws and limitations but we still know that God loves us.

So, when we're faced with hateful, hurtful people, we can more easily see and accept their flaws and, we hope, see them as God's children, equally deserving of His (and our) love.

We have a saying in our house that, when problems arise, we make every attempt to 'Throw Love at it.' No matter what it is and no matter how protracted something may be, 'Throw Love at it.' is the most effective way to get to a problem's core and resolution.

When my daughter was younger, she had to deal with some bullies at school. As many parents know, it can be excruciating to see your child go through this. My initial response was to show her the best place to land a punch but I realized that this was not going to help her. We went through the normal channels and procedures and, by working with the students and school staff, I'm glad to say, it got worked out. During that time, I had many discussions with my daughter about why some people do cruel things. I tried to explain to her that sometimes, people have hurt that they can't deal with so they often pass it on to others - basically, 'hurt people do hurtful things' and that the best way to deal with it (besides letting the teacher know your being bullied) is to try to be kind and be as loving as possible.

I had wondered if that message got through to her. A few months ago, my daughter was telling me about something cruel some kid said to her in school. I told her how awful it was and that I would talk to her teacher if she wanted. She said that wouldn't be necessary and went on to express sorrow for the girl who had made those comments to her because she understood that they must have come from a place of real pain.

When we 'Throw Love at it' we break hate wide open to it's lonely, fearful core. Then, with more love, we can plant seeds of growth that can last a lifetime.




