

LOVE GOD, LOVE CHIENDED HER, GROW DISCIPLES

Reflections:

Today is the Feast of Christ The King, or to be more precise, The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. According to the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), today's feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, in an era marred by 'war, extreme ideologies, and the rise of totalitarian regimes.' Pope Pius XI viewed this new feast as a '...antidote to the atheism and secularism plaguing society.'



Here we stand, almost a century later, and many of the same ills which plagued our world a hundred years ago, are still with us. The placing of this feast on the last Sunday of our liturgical year is significant, because, to me, it signifies an emphatic affirmation of our faith. It says, this is not just what I believe to be true, but it's how I'm going to live my life and lift up lives around me.

Throughout the year, we've taken a journey with Christ, and after all we've read and heard and experienced together, today we stand with and for each other to say, 'Yes! - Christ is King of the Universe.' You know how at the Easter Vigil, when we renew our Baptismal promises as a church Do you remember what Fr says at the end? He says, 'This is our faith. This is the faith of the church, and we are proud to profess it in our Lord Jesus Christ.'

That's good stuff.

As we close out another Liturgical Year, let's not look ahead too soon. Our Lord Jesus Christ is the King of the Universe, but what does it mean for us to have Jesus be King of our universe? What does a kingdom with Jesus as it's king look like? Does my life reflect that? Are the rules of my little universe consistent with the way Jesus lived and with the things that Jesus taught? Are love, compassion, and forgiveness the foundation upon which we've built our families, our communities, our nation?

These aren't always easy questions. Sometimes the answers come quickly. Sometimes we struggle to recognize our true selves in a world that desires to take ownership of us. But, it's ok to struggle. It happens to all of us. Our true selves are only visible in the loving reflection of our Father. We are God's children. And Christ is our King.


