

Reflections:

Faith Found in Stained Glass

When we look around Saint Patrick's Church one of its most distinguishing features is the wonderful stained glass windows. Stained glass windows were championed by a 12th century



abbot by the name of Suger. He believed that the light of Heaven was captured by the glass and gave the people a taste of the splendor of the Kingdom of God. As most people were illiterate, the windows also served to inspire and instruct people in the Bible. For those of us who sometimes become lost in the glory of the Mass, these windows might also help us to wonder at the majesty of God. Over my next few columns I hope to explore with you the amazing stories of the saints depicted in our windows.



Saint Ethnea and Saint Fidelmia were sisters and were born to a pagan king of Ireland named Laoghaire of Connaught. Much of their life story comes from the biography of Saint Patrick and of course oral traditions. The story goes that these two young women met Saint Patrick while he rested near a local well. The women had come to the well as part of their morning rituals and when they saw Patrick and his followers mistook them for gods. Ireland of course was polytheistic in those days. They approached Patrick and asked him if he was a god. Patrick replied that he was not a god and that there was only one God who reigned over Heaven and Earth. As he preached to them, their hearts became opened by the Holy Spirit and they longed to see the face of Christ and to make him their bridegroom. Patrick asked them if they believed in God, in everlasting life, forgiveness of sins, and in the unity of the church. This profession of faith they made with him willingly. He then bestowed upon them a beautiful white veil and they consecrated their lives to Christ. Patrick continued to preach to them on the

mystery of the Eucharist which they received with great joy. And it is said that upon receiving Christ, who was their heart's desire, they fell asleep and entered into Heaven. The story of these two saints spread throughout Connaught and led to the conversion of many lords, commoners, and others who knew the young women. So inspired by their faith, they too wished to know God.

What I see in the story of Saints Ethnea and Saint Fidelmia is how our lives can have an amazing impact on others. We have it in our hands to be examples of love and justice that inspires others just as they did. So we pray to God through the intercession of Saints Ethnea and Fidelmia that our lives might become like theirs. That by living our lives in Christ we might inspire others to seek him.


