

Reflections: A Letter from a YIA Teen about her service experience ...

Hi! My name is Emily. This year was my first year going on a trip like this and, honestly, it was one of the best weeks of my life. When I found out I was allowed to go on the trip I was beyond excited, but as the week got closer and closer I began to feel nervous about it. I had no idea what to expect. Every morning before we went to work we went to mass. It was honestly so amazing to see so many teens worshiping and praising God. After mass was when we would get together with our small group and head out to work.

I worked in Kentucky at a place called the "Rose Garden". It was essentially a huge donation place where families and soon-to-be mothers could go to get things they needed like food, clothes, diapers, blankets, and so much more. My team did so many things there such as package pretzels, candy, sausages, lettuce, and one of our favorites, shortening. It was crazy to think that what we were doing was changing so many people's lives.

Everyday after work we would go to program, and let me tell you it was amazing. It definitely got hot with all the teens singing and dancing but it was one of the best parts of the day. Everyone would gather and, like I said, sing and dance. By the end of the week so many of our voices were gone and our hands almost bruised. Again it was so amazing to see so many teens just praising God. On Tuesday after program they held adoration. I wasn't expecting to feel anything because I've been to adoration before and I knew what it was like but boy I was wrong. I was in tears with Danielle when we got out of the chapel and for who knows what. That was the first time in my life I cried for no reason and it was amazing. God really touched me that night.

On Wednesday, again, after program they held, what they called, four corners. It was a place for prayer. They had every adult sitting on the ground for you to go and pray with. They had a place to pray the rosary and write down a prayer intention on the cross. They also had a place where you could write a letter about whatever and to whoever you want. When I was done writing my letter I remember turning around and Samantha was there in tears. I just hugged her and we cried under a soccer net for like 30 minutes. Everyone cried that night.

On Thursday, before program this time, they had a chance to go and pray the rosary. Me and a group of others from St. Pats and OLL went down and prayed the rosary together. One thing, or person I should say, that I will never forget from that week, is a guy named Mark. He was at work when we were there volunteering and I talked to him one day and he told me that he has been volunteering there for about 2 years, but the thing that stood out to me was when he said that if God had told him 3 years ago that he would be volunteering at the "Rose Garden" he wouldn't have believed God. That stood out to me because it really showed me that God always has a plan for you and will always lead you in the right direction whether or not you believe him.

One last final thing I want to do is thank the parish for helping to send me and everyone else on YIA on this trip. It really made me feel so much closer to God. So thank you for always supporting us.

Last Sunday was a very special day...

At the 10 AM Mass, backpacks were blessed, grandparents were celebrated and a delicious and fun ice cream party was held after the Mass.

Also... our 2024 YIA service trip destination was revealed plus our 9th and 10th graders, and their parents, kicked off the new Faith Formation year by attending the 5 PM Mass, followed by dinner and class.
