



Reflections:

Celebrating the 125th Anniversary of the Building of St. Patrick's Church





America grew tremendously during the 19th century taking on much of the diverse nature we see today. Catholics from Germany and Ireland settled in the United States following famine and political turmoil at home. Their arrival dramatically altered the social and religious nature of the young republic. Boston, which for years had


been a bastion of Puritanism, now took on a very Catholic feel. Nativism welcomed these new Americans, but as the years passed their labor and sacrifice earned them a place in this land.

The first Saint Patrick's community began in Whitinsville in the 1850s as a simple mission. The Blackstone River by that time drew the attention of investors hoping to harness the power of the water to run their mills. As the mills grew so did the demand for cheap labor. Irish and French-Canadian immigrants flocked to Whitinsville in the hopes of securing a prosperous future for themselves and their families. It was during this period of change in Massachusetts that the Church grew and in 1852 Father O'Reilly began to say Mass once a month at Rockdale.

At the close of the great conflagration known as the American Civil War, the Catholic population of Whitinsville grew dramatically. Many people in the community called for the building of a new place of worship to serve the needs of the town. So in 1868, a parcel of land was purchased at the corner of Church and Cross Street. It was here that the Old St. Patrick's Church was built and by 1870 helped to elevate the community to that of a full blown parish nearly twenty years



later. Though French-Canadian immigrants made up the majority of people who celebrated there, the Church took on St. Patrick as its patron.



The Catholic population thrived in Whitinsville and grew so quickly that it became apparent that the old church would not suffice. So in 1889, plans were made to erect a new building - the one we know today and celebrate. In the Autumn of 1898, the cornerstone of the new St. Patrick's Church was laid with much fanfare and celebration. Father O'Reilly selected the North Italian Gothic style for the new building.

Complete with its pointed arches and buttress appearance, the new St. Patrick's Church was modeled on the Cathedral of San Zeno and Prato in Verona, Italy. Having read an article written by Charles MaGinnis lamenting the failure of American churches to embrace their Catholic architectural heritage, Father O'Reilly knew that there was only one man who he could trust with the design and construction of St. Patrick's. MaGinnis would go on to build many other beautiful buildings during his long career, but St. Patrick's was where he rose to fame.



The new design of the building called for the bell tower to move to the opposite end of the building. This, it was thought, would nicely balance the octagonal chapel used for weekday Mass and smaller religious celebrations. The bell itself, "Maggie", was the largest free swinging bell in the United States when it was hoisted into place. A gift to the people of Saint Patrick's by their Protestant brothers

and sisters, it weighed over 5,100 pounds and was officially christened Mary Magdalene.

The interior of St. Patrick's incorporated the basilica design so common in the gothic style. Its

stained glass windows were inspired by the twelfth century French Abbot Suger of St. Dennis. It was he who first argued that stained glass would welcome the light of Heaven into the hearts and minds of the faithful. The lives of the saints of Ireland were depicted with vibrant greens and beautiful golden hues. The center window, in the Chancel, depicted the crucifixion of Jesus and was offset by the windows of St.



Peter and St. Bridget. The original design actually called for the St. Bridget window to feature St. Paul, but for reasons lost to history St. Bridget was chosen instead. The windows of the chapel depict major events in the life of St. Patrick.




One of the most attractive features of Saint Patrick's Church is found in its high-relief sculpted stations of the cross. Created by the renowned French sculptor, Teesow, they would go on to win first prize at the 1893 Chicago World Fair. The stations are one of two made by the celebrated sculptor, but an accident at sea sent its sister set of stations to the bottom of the Atlantic.

The Rose Window

Rose windows date back to Medieval Times and were revived and popularized in the French Gothic period. They are circular, highly decorative windows arranged in a symmetrical, radial pattern that resemble a flower or a rose. These grand and majestic windows are symbolic with religious significance, and they adorn cathedrals and churches all over the world.

High above the main entrance on Cross Street, sits our own beautiful rose window. At the very center is the Shield of the Trinity with Deus (God) as the center node, Pater (Father), Filius (Son), and Spiritus Sanctus (Holy Spirit), at the outer nodes. EST (is) links the outer nodes to the center node, and NON EST (is not) links all outer nodes to one another. It is a traditional symbol and the basis of our faith. That God is one in essence and three in person. There are twelve arms that radiate out from the Shield, which we believe to depict twelve different Saints. Today, we know little of the origin of this window. We can all agree on its beauty. Take another look at this magnificent stained-glass window the next time you're in church. Let it awaken feelings of inspiration, harmony, and unity.
