Reflections:

As I'm typing this from my new office, on a somewhat warm, damp spring day... I'm thinking to myself, starting a new job is a journey! As I consider this transition, I will remember change can feel overwhelming. However, believing in my abilities, focusing on my strengths, and accepting constructive criticism will make any change easier to conquer.


