#### Reflections:





#### LIVING AS FAITHFUL STEWARTS

In Luke 12:32–48, **Jesus** offers both comfort and challenge to His disciples. He begins with reassurance: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). For Catholics, this promise reminds us that we are not striving for a distant, uncertain reward, but are heirs to a kingdom already prepared for us by a loving Father. God's generosity calls forth our trust and courage. Our lives, therefore, should not be consumed by fear or anxiety, but shaped by hope and joyful expectation of His coming.

Immediately following this comfort, **Jesus** invites us into action: "Gird your loins and light your lamps" (Luke 12:35). These words point to spiritual readiness — a watchfulness that is active, not passive. Like servants awaiting their master's return, we are to live each day with purpose, alert to the presence of Christ in the ordinary. The Lord may come at an unexpected hour, and we must not be caught off guard. For Catholics, this speaks directly to the call of daily conversion, prayer, and the frequent reception of the sacraments, which keep our hearts ready and our souls alight.

**Jesus** then offers a powerful image of reward: "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival... he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them" (Luke 12:37). In this stunning reversal, Christ — the Master — serves those who are faithful. This is Eucharistic imagery: the Lord who once washed His disciples' feet now feeds us with His very Body and Blood. Our watchfulness is not in vain. Every moment we give to God in faithfulness will be answered with His own self-giving love.

Finally, **Jesus** warns that much will be expected of those to whom much has been given: "More will be demanded of the person entrusted with more" (Luke 12:48). As Catholics, blessed with the fullness of the faith, the sacraments, and the Church's teaching, we are not called to complacency but to responsibility. Stewardship of time, talent, and treasure; care for the poor; fidelity to truth — these are not optional. Let us live as faithful servants, joyful and vigilant, confident that when the Master returns, He will find us ready, and He Himself will be our reward.




## **Weekly Divine Mercy and Adoration**
