

Reflections:

What is the lesson from John 7:37-39...? (Reading from the Pentecost Vigil)





Using Water, Jesus shows us how we are all spiritually parched and dehydrated and that He alone can quench our thirsty souls. But He doesn't only satisfy this thirst... after we come to Him in **faith and trust**, He also then empowers us with His Spirit to love others and bring them to Jesus!

I love this passage in the bible, it shows us that Jesus announced that this thirst-quenching ministry has two sides to it: First, Jesus came to offer himself as the drink to satisfy our deep, spiritual thirst. Second, Jesus came to give to us the **Holy Spirit** as the living waters that will fill us up to overflowing.

One of my favorite passages in the bible is *Psalm 1*. Many times, I have given this to my friends and family (many of which are non-believers) and I have asked them to read, digest and truly ponder on these words. Again, this scripture talks of how a tree planted by a river has a continual source of **water**. It will never wither away, because it is always getting what it needs. Ask yourself if you are constantly needy, it may be worth examining if you are planted by the rivers of water or not?

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers.

But whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law, day and night. **That person is like a tree planted by streams of water**, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither — whatever they do will prosper — from Psalm 1
