Reflections:

This weekend we celebrate The Most Holy Trinity; God the Father, God the Son and God the Spirit. As a boy in Catholic School, we were taught that there was one God, and God exists in three distinct persons, but still was one God. I could never really grasp the concept of Jesus and God as one being when I was a child. How could a father and son be the same person? I was an



inquisitive child when it came to spiritual matters (still am!), but the answers I got from my teachers, priests, and sisters offered no real clarity. Perhaps, I was asking the wrong questions. I've grown to be ok with this mystery, because when it comes to complex theological questions, I think less is best.

In paragraph II, of article I, of chapter I, of section II, of part I of the Catechism of The Catholic Church, called, *The Profession of Faith*; line 234 says...

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life.

It also states that,

The Most Holy Trinity is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith". (Vatican Website)

It goes on in more detail and explanation about the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity but to me, I'm good! You had me at *mystery*. I'll take a plate of mystery any day of the week, with a side of question and drizzled with uncertainty. To me, that's a recipe for spiritual growth if there ever was one. How can God work in our lives if we think we know the answers? When there is mystery, there is usually some sort of exploration. Great things happen when we approach spiritual matters with 'I don't know.'

St Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556), in his autobiography, tells a story of living in a Dominican monastery and, while contemplating the mysteries of the Blessed Trinity, he was swept away by a vision, that 'carried him beyond the earth.' In his vision, St Ignatius beheld the Blessed Trinity as different strings, or tones, of a harp. He was so overwhelmed with emotion by this vision that he couldn't stop weeping. Would St Ignatius' vision have happened if he'd had a clear understanding of the Blessed Trinity? Or did the mystery of it provide fertile soil, allowing for his interpretive vision? Perhaps St Patrick was contemplating the mystery of the Trinity when he held a shamrock for the first time? Or maybe it was the other way around, and he was so moved by the beauty of Ireland that he began to see God everywhere. No one knows.

I'm ok with not knowing. I'm ok with giving God some extra room in which to work. Not that God needs it. Probably more like God loves me so much, he lets me think that I'm giving him extra room to work with.

So, let's embrace not having all the answers. For some of us, it can be hard to hand over control like that, but how much control do we really think we have? The more certainty we have, the less faith we need; the less faith we need, the less faith we have.

Our faith journey is a process. Sometimes, the more we think we know, the less we actually know. So, if *mystery* is a central part of our faith, it seems to me that we have an excellent road map for our journey; God is the destination, Jesus is the way, the rest is blank. It's up to us to chart our course.


