

Reflections:

Luke 11:1-13... Jesus taught us how to pray!





Prayer isn't always polite. Prayers cannot be sequestered to safe corners of our lives. Life is bumpy and unpredictable. So also, are our prayers that occur across the whole sweep of just such a life. Prayer signifies, "asking" means making a request, "seeking" implies persistence or fervor, and "knocking" represents continued and ongoing persistence.

In this verse, Jesus doubles down on the promise.

Jesus encourages his disciples to ask for what is wanted with eyes fixed not on the object of our request but on God the Father. God is wise and God will certainly give what is needed. Therefore, this scripture confirms that our greatest gift is the **Holy Spirit.**

Before you utter a request, before you confess a sin, before you pray for the need of another, before you ask for deliverance or protection of any kind — before any of that — make sure that you remember who it is that you are praying to and the story that you are living within because as you do, your prayers will be redefined and your living will be redefined.

In the Lord's Prayer Jesus teaches his disciples how to pray. He provides a model prayer that includes praise to God, a request for daily needs, forgiveness of sins, and guidance away from temptation. This highlights key elements of prayer: reverence for God, dependence on Him, and the importance of forgiveness.

This passage emphasizes that God is generous and desires to bless those who earnestly seek Him. Overall, for me this passage teaches about the nature of prayer, persistence in seeking God, and His willingness to respond to our needs with generosity. God hears our prayers and encourages us to be persistent and bold in our requests.



Vacation Bible School Registration





Welcome to the OLV update, a biweekly entry to your parish bulletin. Here we will post news and information regarding Our Lady of the Valley Regional School, the wonderful Catholic elementary school and middle school academy located in the Blackstone Valley, sponsored and supported by St. Mary Parish, St. Patrick Parish and St. Peter Parish. We are blessed to have your prayers and support!

Over the summer, Our Lady of the Valley School provides a number of Summer Activity Camps, including those focused on sports, games, creative arts and music. We are also blessed to host the Totus Tuus camp in conjunction with our local parishes in the Lower Blackstone Valley. Totus Tuus, a Latin phrase meaning "totally yours," is a Catholic summer youth program dedicated to sharing the Gospel and promoting the Catholic faith through catechesis, evangelization, Christian witness and Eucharistic worship. The goal of Totus Tuus is to help young people further understand and strengthen their faith in Jesus Christ. By establishing a real and personal relationship with Him, participants can be led to the love of the Father in the Spirit and so be made sharers in the life of the Holy Trinity.

The camp is led by young Catholic adults and seminarians, and it is designed to bring our youth closer to Jesus through daily Mass, skits, songs, games and other fun activities. The methodology, structure, content and enthusiasm of Totus Tuus are concerned not only with teaching the Faith, but also with igniting the hearts of the team members and the young people they encounter. The result has been the formation of young adults who continue to dedicate themselves to the Church's mission of evangelization along with many vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The theme of this year's Totus Tuus camp is The Sacraments and The Joyful Mysteries. We look forward to welcoming all involved to Our Lady of the Valley School and The GRACE Center for this year's camp!
