Reflections:

Dear Friends,

It is said that one day St. Francis of Assisi entered the dining room and saw his brothers eating a lavish meal, forgetful of those who are poor. Francis takes the plate of food, mixes it with ashes, and eats seated on the floor. It was a strong lesson in humility.



In today's gospel, Jesus shares a meal with his critics. How do we know that? Luke tells us,

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

They were observing him. It does not seem like a friendly crowd. Jesus tells them a parable. The reason why is this,

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table.

In fact, it looks like he tells them two parables. Both parables have to do with table fellowship – that is to say, who eats with whom.

In the early Christian communities, Jews and Gentiles, slaves and free, man and woman, poor and rich, high and low all gathered at the table together to share a meal. "Who sits where" became an issue. Jesus invites his followers to let go of status and embrace humility. Put others first.

For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.

That is to say, don't make yourself the center of attention, the most important person in the room. Rather, be humble. People sometimes say, LIFE IS NOT ABOUT YOU. That is another way to look at today's gospel and humility. We all know what a blessing it is to have people in your life who live by the principle: life is not about me. We do in fact admire those people. We also know how challenging people who think it is all about them can be.

This is not something new. In the book of Sirach (our first reading), the wisdom teacher instructs a child: "My child, conduct your affairs with humility."

The host of the dinner faces a different challenge: whom to invite. In Jesus' time, you invited those who could and would invite you in return. You never invite poor people because they were in no position to invite you and return the favor. The underlying principle is the same. What is there for me, how will I benefit from inviting you. Again, it is all about me. The list that Jesus is proposing would be unthinkable and unacceptable: the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. They would never be able to repay you.

In Jesus' mind, everyone is welcomed, and it is not just about me, or you, or anyone. Matthew Kelly defines humility as "thinking about yourself less." Maybe, just maybe, IT'S ALL ABOUT ME attitude is the original sin that gets us into trouble. And Maybe Jesus speaks so much about humility as IT IS NOT because it is the best cure. I don't know... what do you think?




