## Reflections:

Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel reading and the parable of the mustard seed has to do with faith. You could say that the Bible rests on faith. The Bible speaks of people of faith as well as people who lack faith or have little faith. The Bible is meant to inspire us and lead us into deeper faith.



What is faith? – Often times faith is misunderstood. Some people say that faith is anti-intellectual; that it settles for easy answers in the world that is very messy and complex. That is what some critics of faith say: "Faith is settling for things for which there is no evidence." That is why some people dismiss faith all together. But that is not "faith" as you find it in the Bible. Real faith is not below reason or believing without reason.

Because, our ability to think, to reason, to use our intellect is the gift from God and God respects that gift, faith and reason are two sides of the same coin. Raith without reason can be dangerous and lead to superstition and wishful thinking but at the same time real faith often comes into play when reason can't give you an answer; when you are faced WITH MYSTERY. So, what is faith? Faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God in my life and in the world and openness to what God will do, can do, and desires to do. You cannot predict with accuracy, calculate with precision, dictate what God will do in your life because we are not in charge. That is why trust is essential.

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." When it comes to faith, I don't to have to have it all figured out, I don't have to depend only on my own strength and will power. It is more than my own efforts. I don't have to be in control. That is what faith in God is all about.

What else do we learn about faith in today's Gospel. Jesus says, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." That would be something amazing, don't you think? The point is simple. Amazing things can happen if you trust in God, if you entrust your life to God, if you are willing to follow him, learn from him, seek his wisdom. In fact, God wants us to live amazing lives. You and I, we all have faith, but you and I can also grow in faith. What is the next step in your trust in God?

Maybe you are struggling with prayer, or you are coming back to the church, or you just go through the motions, or you need guidance in a relationship, or with a decision, or you experience lack of faith. What is the next step you can take to trust more in God? In what area of your life do you need more trust in God — that is to say, faith-increase?
