#### Reflections:

Prayer is a strange phenomena. I mean, think about it, when we pray; we're talking to someone or some being whose very existence can't be proven by any scientific measure, and yet, we pray fervently for this unknown entity to intervene in a way which has been, and most likely will continue to be, imperceptible to us; and this intervention, we pray, will be delivered to us via some mystical, supernatural back ally communication network.



Like, seriously? Sounds a little crazy, right?

Why would we do such a thing? Why would we bring our most difficult, most painful, most pressing life issues to prayer when we are at our most desperate? We offer up the names of those we love most, even those who are on death's door, in prayer, hoping that God will hear us.

Why?

Why do we do this?

The answer is simple.

We do it because it works. If prayer didn't work, we probably wouldn't do it.

Full disclosure, I have no idea how prayer works. It's a funny thing that, in my own life, the older I've gotten, and the more I've learned, the less certain I am of so many things. But, there are some things that I do feel certain about. Like, if I find a white key on the piano, and play that note together with the black key directly above it, it's probably not going to sound so good to most people. But, if I spread those two keys apart, and then play them together, it's not so bad. In a similar way, a C and an F# played at the same time on a piano doesn't make the sweetest sound. But, put a D underneath, now we're cooking up possibilities! I know these things because I've spent nearly my entire life learning a musical language. I don't know exactly why music moves people, but I know that it does. I know this because I've seen it, and perhaps more convincingly, I've felt it.

I've seen amazing things happen as a result of prayer; in my own life, and in others' lives. Something happens to us when we pray that we will never understand. God is at work in and around us, through us, before us and after us. God is subatomic! Ultra elementary! God is matter and anti-matter. When we spend time with God we are sitting with eternity, and when we talk to God, we're changing our trajectory and opening ourselves to countless positive possibilities. Talking to God always makes things better, even though we can't necessarily see it.

Whenever we have a decision to make, or a difficult conversation to have, God should be there with us, because it is from God that we receive the love, strength and wisdom needed to be our best, most compassionate selves, and making the best, most compassionate decisions.

In our Gospel this week, Jesus tells us another parable about prayer. Jesus wants us to make prayer a central part of our lives. If prayer wasn't an effective way for us to experience God's grace, Jesus wouldn't have taken the time to teach us how to pray. The Gospel of Luke has more accounts of Jesus praying than any other Gospel. Clearly, Luke saw the importance of prayer in his own life.

Can we see the importance of prayer in ours?
