Most successful people would probably tell you that what separates great people from ordinary people is that great people are willing to risk making decisions, whether right or wrong, and then acting on those decisions. Great people are people who have made great choices, often very risky choices, but in the long run their choices have usually been right. Biblical history is peopled with folks who were confronted by decisions they had to make.


Just imagine the decision required of those fishermen on the shores of Lake Galilee. Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John were fishermen, true, but they were businessmen. Perhaps even prosperous businessmen. Fish was a staple in the diet, and fishermen could often make a very good living. The brothers Peter and Andrew were

probably business partners with the brothers James and John and most likely had a good business going. So when Jesus said to the two sets of brothers, "Follow me," He was not calling them to leave a sport, or a hobby; he was asking them to leave their careers, their livelihoods, and their families! They had everything to lose.

What have we left behind to follow Him? Unless there's some pain, some discomfort, some sacrifice, then most probably we haven't left anything. Perhaps we're still fumbling about in our boats, tossing our nets over the side, and business goes on as usual.

Yet, if we do that, the Great Fisherman might leave us and move on to someone else, and the choice might go by forever.

## St. John Chrysostom on Saints Peter and Paul

"For what is greater than Peter? And what is equal to Paul? These men surpassed, in deed and in word, all creation, both in the heavens and on the earth. For even though they were bound up in the mire of the body, they were nevertheless found to be better even than the angels. What, then, can we say to those who were teachers of both the higher and the lower creation? I can find no word worthy to glorify those who are the glory of our race, who traversed every land and sea, pulling up the roots of sins and sowing the seeds of piety in the hearts of indominable men.

Peter was the leader of the apostles, and Paul was the teacher of all the world and the cocommunicant of the hosts on high. Peter was the bridle of the stubborn Jews, and Paul
was the admonition of the gentiles. And behold the transcendent wisdom of the Master!
For he chose Peter from out of the fishermen, but Paul from out of the tentmakers. And
he did this for a reason: for it brought low the glory of the Jews. For this reason, the Lord
entrusted them to this particular fisherman, saying, *Go out into the sea and cast your hook,*and take up the first fish that comes up, and open its mouth, and you will find a stater (Mt
17:27). By "the sea" he means the immovable will of the lawless Jews. By the "hook" he
means the subtle word of doctrine. By the "fish" he means the Law. By the opening of its
mouth, he means the interpretation of the Law. And by finding a stater therein he means
the drawing forth of the Law's spiritual meaning.

But to Paul, as a tentmaker, he entrusted the gentiles, that he might, through the Law and Grace, clothe the naked with the red garment dyed in the blood and body of the Lord. For this reason the Lord cries out to him, saying, *Go forth, for I will send you far off, unto the nations* (Acts 22:21) ...

Paul and Peter, who illumine the Church day after day. They are the treasuries of the Lord, the shelter of all the world, the receptacles of the Spirit, the keys that unlock the mysteries of the Holy Trinity, and the exegetes of the dispensation of the divine Word!"

# **A Moment with the Catechism** The Holy Mysteries of Christian Life

### Our Baptism is "The Blessing of the Jordan"

413 In the Rite of Baptism, the Church prays that "the grace of salvation and the blessing of the Jordan" descend upon the water. We pray that in this Baptism, that which was revealed at the river Jordan will be realized now. There, the Father, through the Holy Spirit, declared Jesus to be his beloved Son. That which was manifested in Christ—being the Son of God—becomes the reality of all who are baptized.


Upon you also, if you possess sincere piety, the Holy Spirit will descend, and from above will be heard over you the voice of the Father, saying not "This is my Son" but "This has now become my son." For to Christ alone belongs the "is" ... To you belongs "has now become," since you do not possess the sonship by nature, but receive it by adoption. He is Son eternally, but you receive that grace by advancement. (Cyril of Jerusalem, The Catechetical Lectures, 3, 14: PG 33, 444-445.)

414 Baptism is the first Mystery that a person needs to receive in order to enter the Church, the ark of salvation. It is the means by which one becomes a member of the Church, the Body of Christ. "Whence is it that we are Christians? Through our faith would be the universal answer. And in what way are we saved? Plainly because we were regenerated through the grace given in our baptism." Baptism unlocks the access to the other Holy Mysteries and sacred rites in the Church through which the Lord sanctifies, vivifies, and leads his Church as a whole and each believer in particular. This is why the baptized already become "heirs of the kingdom" and receive the "blessedness of the saints."

O most glorious and laudable disciples of Christ, Peter and Paul, first-enthroned and equally enthroned holy Apostles, who have enlightened all the universe with the holy Faith and will come with Christ to judge the whole world! Your proper dignity is not on earth, but is the glory and praise rendered in heaven. Accepting now our unworthy entreaty, by your worthy supplications preserve us from all misfortunes, and beseech Christ, the just Judge, to be merciful to us at the last judgment, that, saved by your mediation, we may chant to God our Savior: Alleluia, alleluia! (Three times).

# **Quote of the Week** – *The Meaning of Love*

"The meaning and worth of love, as a feeling, is that it really forces us, with all our being, to acknowledge for ANOTHER the same absolute central significance which, because of the power of our egoism, we are conscious of only in our own selves. Love is important not as one of our feelings, but as the transfer of all our interest in life from ourselves to another, as the shifting of the very center of our personal life. This is characteristic of every kind of love, but predominantly of sexual love; it is distinguished from other kinds of love by greater intensity, by a more engrossing character, and by the possibility of a more complete overall reciprocity. Only this love can lead to the real and indissoluble union of two lives into one; only of it do the words of Holy Writ say: 'They shall be one flesh,' i.e., shall become one real being."
