#### PREPARE FOR LENT

### What does it mean to Fast?

To fast is to do without food. Its purpose is to experience the effects of not eating. It also serves to be a penance or a sacrifice.—for the purpose of strengthening us. When we don't eat, we get hungry. When we get hungry, we have a heightened sense of awareness. In this state, we are more apt to ask God to purify us and prepare us to pray more deeply.

#### What does it mean to Abstain?

To abstain is to not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Its purpose is to be an act of penance—an act of sacrifice. Of course not eating meat and then having a more enjoyable meal instead would defeat the purpose. Some people do not eat meat so it is not an issue for them. Maybe abstaining from a meal you really want would be a sacrifice. Many people in the world cannot afford or do not have access to meat. Abstaining from meat can put us in solidarity them.
