FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

As you are most likely aware, this has been a momentous week regarding an important decision issued by the Supreme Court in the decision *Dobbs v. Jackson*, overturning Roe v. Wade that claimed there was a constitutional right to abortion. I thought the statement made by Cardinal O'Malley was great. He wrote: "For all of us who have spoken, written, worked, marched, and prayed to reverse Roe v. Wade, today's Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson is deeply significant and encouraging. This decision will create the possibility of protecting human life from conception; it calls us to recognize the unique burden faced by women in pregnancy; and it challenges us as a nation to work together to build up more communities of support — and available access to them — for all women experiencing unplanned pregnancies.

"During the past half-century, as the abortion debate continued, the Catholic Church has often been accused of imposing a religious belief on our pluralistic society. It is indeed the case that, when addressing the Catholic community, the Church has used both religious and moral arguments to oppose abortion. But when engaging the wider American civil society, elected officials, and our legal system, the Church has defended human life from its inception as a matter of human rights. Our continued efforts in advocating our position on the protection of unborn children is consistent with our advocacy for issues affecting the dignity of all persons at all stages and in all circumstances of life. The Church employs this principle of consistency in addressing issues of race, poverty, and human rights generally. It is a position that presents a moral argument as a foundation for law and policy to protect human life."

Unfortunately and sadly, this decision caused a violent reaction that lead to clashes with protesters on opposing sides and defacing and firebombing of pregnancy crisis centers and even churches and houses of worship, some actions targeting Catholic churches. It's hard to believe that attempting to protect life, particularly that of an unborn child, the most fragile and innocent of all life, has become so violent and divisive. We need to pray that God will help heal the divisions that are becoming much more pronounced in our country, especially as we prepare to celebrate the 246th anniversary of our country's birth.

July 6. 2022:

<u>Feast Day of St. Maria Teresa</u> <u>Goretti</u>

Maria Teresa Goretti (October 16, 1890 – July 6, 1902) is an Italian virgin-martyr of the Catholic

Church, and one of the youngest saints to be canonized. She was born to a farming family. Her father died when she was nine, and they had to share a house with another family, the Serenellis. Maria took over household duties while her mother, brothers, and sister worked in the fields.

One afternoon, <u>Alessandro</u>, the Serenellis' twenty-year-old son, made sexual advances to her. When she refused to submit to him, he stabbed her fourteen times. She was taken to the hospital but she died forgiving him. He was arrested, convicted, and jailed. During imprisonment, he repented. After 27 years he was released from prison and visited her mother to beg forgiveness, which she granted. He later became a <u>lay brother</u> in a monastery, dying in 1970. She was <u>beatified</u> in 1947, and canonized in 1950. She is especially venerated in the Congregation of the Passion (Passionists).

Summer is finally on our doorstep. Along with summer, there is HOT weather. Along with hot weather is BEACH attire. We ask that you keep this in mind:

DRESS APPROPRIATELY FOR MASS! Beach clothes are for the beach! Church clothes are for church!

Skimpy "beach attire" creates a distraction in church and, furthermore, doesn't display reverence for the presence of Jesus. If Jesus were visiting our home we would get "dressed up". We should do the same when we visit Jesus in church. Thank you.

THE POWER OF A CANDLE BURNING BRIGHTLY

Fire is a powerful symbol. That's why flame plays such a prominent role in our liturgies. It helps us to understand Jesus as the Light of the world. We have the opportunity to light a candle as a symbol of our love for departed family and friends and to have it burn brightly for seven days. Witnessing it connects us with our loved one. And knowing that it burns throughout the day and night comforts us. A SANCTUARY LAMP signifies the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. We have two—one in the church and the other in the chapel. Call the Office to arrange for either of them to burn for your loved one for seven days. The donation is \$10. You may also choose to light a vigil candle in front of Our Blessed Mother's statue in the rear of the church for a goodwill offering. Experience the power and energy of a candle burning brightly.
